CONSTRUCTION OF A NEW TRAINING CENTER AT SUKUTA SANCHABA JOLA KUNDA IN WEST COAST REGION

The Construction of a New Training Center in Sukuta Sanchaba Jola Kunda, Kombo North District, West Coast Region in The Republic of The Gambia, West Africa, called The Youth Integration Training Center (YITC) could not have come at a better time. The idea to construct such a center is conceived at a time when the continuous clandestine movement of potential youths out of the country through what is commonly referred to as Back Way to Europe is in the increase. Most of this risk-taking journey in search of greener pasture often end up leaving them either bankrupt or stranded on the way after investing so much for the venture. A number of them at times end up losing their lives and if lucky, they enter Europe broken, desperate, destitute without any skillful knowledge preparing them for the future challenges in that part of the world. At the end, some of them lacking the required skills and knowledge will resort to the abuse and trafficking of all sorts of drugs, or engage in all forms of banditry to make to make a quick living at the expenses of those hardworking innocent people found hosting them. Some of them cause so much nuisance that they automatically become unwelcomed in a place they

call their second dream home. To address such a situation. The Youth Integration Training Center (YITC) has been conceived to prepare the youths of The Gambia in particular, those in West Coast Region and their surroundings to be enrolled in order to benefit from capacity building training. The Center intends to provide the training needed to prepare the youths for future gainfully employment thereby stemming the flow of youth migration to Europe through back ways. It is the motto of the Center that, "not all that glitters in Europe is gold". That is position to acquire training, skills, and knowledge to be able to chart their future destine instead of engaging on a dangerous journey and depending on an imaginary dream that will end up shattering ones entire hope to the point of nor return. Such a waste serves no economic benefit for the country nor for the community and its people as well.

The Center plans to come out with a policy document that clearly visualizes the objective

of setting up such a project for the youths. However, the profile document as herein outlined shows the entire project cost and seeks to look for funding in order to construct such a facility in the area of the benefit of all and sundry.

The Center plans to open seven specialized training units under one roof as shown below:

- 1. Computer Science & Literacy
- 2. Agricultural Development
- 3. Carpentry & Wood Work
- 4. Building & Construction
- 5. Mechanical & Engineering
- 6. Painting, Artistry & Artisanal
- 7. Entrepreneurial Training

The mission of the Center — is to advocate against irregular migration to Europe. That is, the Center will serve as an advocacy unit to lead the campaign for "Operation No Back Way to Europe". Its establishment is to deter young Gambians from embarking on the perilous journey in search of greener pastures in Europe and other parts of the world, when they can engage themselves into other meaningful socioeconomic ventures such as training, skill development, capacity building, farming and other entrepreneurial undertakings to make a good living and stay of comfortable life at home. The successful establishment of The Youth Integration Training Center (YITC) will immediately help address the problem of irregular migration, travelling by sea on small boats to Europe or by the Sahara through Liby a to Europe. Its establishment will also help engage the youths into meaningful socioeconomic activities, change them into becoming productive citizens and give them the brightness they so deserved for the future.

Voyaging across the volatile sea or traveling through the host and unfriendly desert only to loss one's possession and lite is as dangerous as slaping oneself at the back for no good reason. The need to remedy this situation is a necessity as the implication of such illegal migration is one of a challenge to all African Countries including The Gambia. That is more the reason why The Center is seeking funding or financial support through aid agencies, international and bilateral organizations to be able to construct and establish such a project to settle "the unsettles".

The aims and objectives for establishing the center are: — To provide quality and relevant education aimed at bringing sustainable peace and development to the needy. In addition, to empower but stand against those wanting to use back way in search of greener pastures. — To spur growth and development in their country through agriculture thereby [page 1/4]

[p. 2] engaging youths to be trained as real time agriculturists (farmers and gardeners) for the country to be food self-sufficient. That is, to promote large-scale agricultural production among others. — To train the youths to become good entrepreneurs who will venture into small-scale micro enterprises through provision of financial Services by way of micro lending (short-term loans) from the Commercial Banks as well as the Micro-Finance Banks. In partnership with the Center, the commercial banks will help promote and encourage the culture of Savings by providing easy access to micro credit facilities after completion of training. Such micro finance interventions will no doubt keep the youths focused as entrepreneurs instead of plying the back way journey to Europe. — To operate through registered Youth Societies or Village Development Committees (VDCs) by way of partnership through a supervised Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) as will be sign between the Center and the parties. — To train them through gainful income generating ventures and help identify reliable markets for their local produces. — To encourage and support the active participation of youths towards the country's path socio-economic advancement inculcating the ideals of self-reliance, patriotism and hard work. — To forge links with Aid Agencies, as well as other Local and International Organizations who may wish to support the sustainable growth of The Center. This may include the UNDP, UNICEF, UNAIDS, CCF, GF, Action Aid The Gambia. European Union, International Migration Office (IMO) et cetera.

Methods of Operation

The Center will be opened in Sukuta Village North District, West Coast Region, The Gambia, West Africa. It will operate seven specialized classes with 50 students per class for a start. With an annual enrollment of 350 students, this number will be maintained fro three semesters and then increase slightly if need be and upon available funding. There will be enroll on Computer Science & Literacy, Agriculture & Development, Carpentry & Woodwork, Building & Construction, Mechanics & Engineering, Painting & Artisanal, Marketing & Entrepreneurial Training.

The Center will start with twenty (20) active staff:

- a Seven Teachers with three reserves in total ten (10) teachers.
 - b A Principal
 - c A Deputy Principal
 - d A Secretary

g Two watchmen (night & day) (2) h A Store keeper i A Security Officer Target Groups. The Center's main area of concentration will be in the urban areas, targeting the poor especially those unemployed youths found not engaged into anything meaningful. According to statistics, 90% of illegal migration stems from urban areas where the facility and means of travel are easily made available to them. Most of the youths after travelling from the rural to the urban areas in search of jobs and failing to secur one in those areas will resort to making up their minds to travel abroad in whatever means. With frustration and peer pressure, this is when they start to count their journey to Europe even if it

means dying on the way.

The center will undertake series of groundbreaking sensitization and community outreach programs to challenge communities on the effects of back way, on the harmful use of ban substances like drugs and alcohol to name just a few.

Rural improvement. It is no secret that the majority of Gambians, about 75% reside in rural areas where they depend entirely on land for their livelihood. In a country, which is, blessed with abundant arable land and predominantly agricultural, one cannot talk about improvement in the life of the rural poor without developing their agricultural needs. That is the reason why The Center will concentrate heavily in teaching and training youths in agriculture, farming and gardening. This is because it is the backbone of the economy accounting for 25% of GDP, supporting 70% of the work force and providing over 90% of the domestic export earnings. For The Center, this method will be the fastest way to fight hunger. improve livelihood and curb rural-urban drift, the gateway to illegal migration to Europe.

The Challenges for the Center — It is to prepare the despaired youths into becoming citizens of the country thereby contributing meaningfully to the socioeconomic development of the country. — To develop a spirit of collective youth participation, patriotism, self-reliance and a fulfilled life for all devoid of poverty. — To empower them through capacity building and skill training for those in need and wanting to be responsible citizens in future.

Factors of Development. The Center recognizes that success and peace cannot be achieved in families without the effective participation and support for women and youth. They are indispensable partners in economic

[p. 3] development and growth; hence the need to empower them accordingly by targeting them into this training scheme and developing their respective potentials.

Youth in Development. The Center aimed at promoting the interest of Youths in a participatory framework through appropriate skill training, abstinence in the usage of dangerous drugs, crimes or other social vises. Such a facility will seek to address youth education, training, and welfare needs. The Center will give Youth Participation the emphasis and prominence it so required.

Transportation. Since the Center is planning to go country wide, there will be need to purchase one vehicle for its administrative and rural outreach programs. The availability of such vehicles will help greatly in monitoring, and recruiting youths across the country with ease especially during raining seasons.

Strategic Objective. The Center's strategic objective for the first five years is to undertake the following: — Conducting more community outreach programs. — Ensuring greater community involvement and participation in youth training and development. — Working handin-hand in support of Government policies and programs in curbing illegal youth integration — Collaborating with International and Regional Organizations, Aid Agencies and the Private Sector in addressing the needs of the youths.

Strategic Plan. — To train and facilitate access to such short-term loans to reduce their level of poverty. — To build their habit of savings and give them confidence in entrepreneurship. — To help increase their capital base and improve their cash management skills through such capacity building scheme.

Strategic Programs

Education is the only known tool against ignorance and poverty, and the center will concentrate in boosting their enrollment, retention and performance in training to become productive in future.

Agriculture plays a significant role in the economic growth and development of a country as it provides food, income and employment. The Center in its training of the youth will: — Promote the growth of agricultural production such as horticulture, food crops, poultry, fishing, and livestock production. — Target and train for the establishment of seed banks, and promoting training and research in Agricultural Education at village and community level.

Youths are the crop of a Nation, the lifeline of development and the breeding ground for sustainable growth. The Center therefore will:

— Target young unemployed men and women by exposing their full potentials to initiate actions, which promote their own development and that of their communities. — Targeting existing youth organizations across the country to preach against crimes, the use of dangerous drugs, alcohol and to nurture in them the spirit of responsible citizenship and productivity.

Project Investments

The Center intends to invest heavily in its Management Information System, in both computer software and hardware, to handle to take care of its information needs to be able to have accurate and timely information regarding its daily operations and administration.

Due to the high costs of operation with shareholders limited resources to cover such, the center will require funding support to be able to meet its operational and administrative objective thereby fulfilling its mission statement of curbing the back-way syndrome.

The Center plans to expand its operations if the experiment for the first three semesters works successfully through. The training facility will remain at one place in Sukuta but the outreach programs and youth sensitization services in the Greater Banjul Area and other rural areas in the Kombos will be extended upon needs.


The Benefits of the Project: Will ensure greater youth participation in community affairs.

Preliminary remark: We urge a continuation of the Y.I.L.P. on the Gambian side beyond 2021 and are therefore still looking for further international support:

PROJECT NAME. Youth Integration and Livelihood Improvement Project (project to improve living conditions through the integration of young people: YILI').

CORE PROGRAM. The aim of the project is to draw the attention of qualified and committed Gambian youth away from the determining factors of migration.

PLACE. This project is carried out in The Gambia by regional and local administrators.

AIMS. First: The improvement of skills in creating and maintaining the livelihoods of around 1500 young people

people in The Gambia. — Second: To improve the skills of around 800 young people in The Gambia with regard to responsibility and protection of their own health and the protection of their livelihoods by 2020/2021. — Third: To encourage the participation of around 800 young people in Gambia in community-level projects and social actions by 2020/2021.

TARGET GROUP. The project is aimed specifically at vulnerable Gambian adolescents and young adults between 15 and 35 who live in excluded, socially disadvantaged and vulnerable (D.E.V.) conditions and their families. Overall, the D.E.V. are young people who have only limited access to employment opportunities, training and educational opportunities, around 3100 young people and young adults, of which 1788 young men and 1312 young women (based on 2018 figures).]
