Scams

We have been contacted by members with more scams. Please see below for the information that our residents have received.

As always, please do not open an email from anyone you do not know and just delete it and do not give any of your personal information over the phone to anyone you do not know and end the call.

a) Ocado

A message comes from ocado@ocadomail.com offering various things. The members was a 0.1p voucher and all he had to do was log on.

The message is very professionally produced and luckily, he was already aware of it.

b) Amazon Prime

The member received a call this morning (15th) from 07909336684 which looks like a UK mobile but the member could not find it in any UK listing. The lady on the call informed him that his Amazon Prime subscription runs out and unless he informs them otherwise, they will automatically take £79.99 from his bank account and renew the subscription.

If he didn't want to renew then he should press 1 and talk to their customer service manager. This is one of those calls that when you press 1, you are connected to Nigeria or Romania and the call costs you about £15 per minute.

As he has never had Amazon prime, he ignored the request to press 1.

2) Temporary Road Closures

a) Chaingate Avenue and Newington Gardens, Southend-on-Sea – Essential Tree Maintenance Works – 22nd October for 1 day.

To facilitate essential tree maintenance works, they have imposed a:

Temporary prohibition of entry, waiting, loading and unloading in Chaingate Avenue and temporary prohibition of entry in Newington Gardens, Southend-on-Sea.

All vehicles will be prohibited from:

Entering, Waiting, loading and unloading in Chaingate Avenue,

Outside and Opposite from Nos 2/4 to Nos 8/10;

Entering, Waiting, loading and unloading in Chaingate Avenue

Outside Nos 22-24; and

Outside No. 23

Entering Chaingate Avenue from its junction with Newington Gardens

These prohibitions or restrictions will come into effect on **22nd October 2020 for 1 day**. This notice will remain in force for 5 days, to allow for unexpected events/delays and possible remedial works. Access for residents will be maintained where possible.

b) Southchurch Road, Southend-on-Sea – Emergency Gas Works – 21st October 2020 for 1 week.

To facilitate essential gas works, they have imposed a:

Prohibition of parking, waiting, stopping, loading & unloading on Southchurch Avenue, Southend-on-Sea.

Whilst this notice is in operation, all vehicles will be prohibited from:

PARKING, WAITING, STOPPING, LOADING & UNLOADING ON SOUTHCHURCH AVENUE BETWEEN ITS JUNCTIONS WITH AMBLESIDE DRIVE & SOUTHCHURCH ROUNDABOUT.

These prohibitions or restrictions came into effect on **21st October 2020**. This notice will remain in force for a period of 21 days or the duration of the works whichever is the earliest. **It is anticipated that the works will last for 1 week.**

3) A127 Major Works (A127 and the Bell Junction)

A127 Bell Junction - 19th Oct to 23rd Oct

There will be off-peak (09:00 to 15:00) northbound lane closures on Hopleythick Lane, and westbound off-peak (09:00 to 15:00) lane closures on the A127 (at the Bell Junction), for kerb removal and new carriageway widening works.

A127 Essential Major Maintenance - 19th Oct to 27th Oct

Carriageway reconstruction and resurfacing to be undertaken during night-time (20:00 to 06:30) eastbound road closures:

Tues 20th Oct to Friday 23rd Oct - from the Tesco Roundabout to The Bell Junction
Sat 24th Oct to Sun 25th Oct - from The Bell Junction to Cuckoo Corner Roundabout
Mon 26th Oct to Tues 27th Oct - Cuckoo Corner Roundabout (from Manners Way to Victoria Avenue) to Victoria Avenue (entry point from Roundabout)

Carriageway drainage gully repairs and installation works are continuing during the daytime (09:00 to 15:00), under westbound lane closures, from the Bell Junction to Borough Boundary.

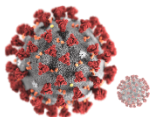

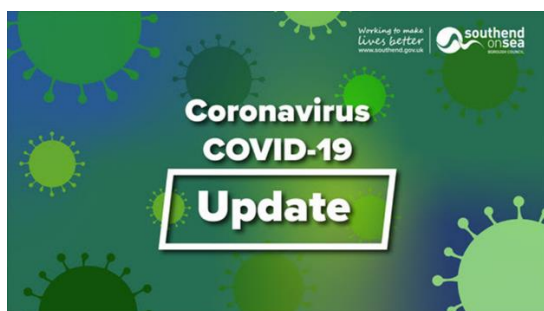
6) Coronavirus Information

in Southend and England ***

London, Essex, York and other areas moving to Tier 2 alert level

Millions of people in London, Essex, York and other areas face tougher Tier 2 COVID-19 measures from Saturday, the Government has announced. It comes as a further 18,980 cases and 138 deaths within 28 days of a positive test were reported in the UK yesterday with Health Secretary Matt Hancock warning “things will get worse before they get better”.



Southend-on-Sea remains at COVID MEDIUM alert at current time

Southend-on-Sea remains in COVID alert level MEDIUM (tier 1) and the council will not yet request to be moved into the second tier of the Government's new national COVID-alert system.

The decision follows Essex County Council's request to the secretary of state made on Tuesday 13 October to move to tier two (high alert). which was granted on 15th October.

However, the Council and its partners remain seriously concerned by the rate of increase in positive cases in Southend-on-Sea (from 13.65 positive cases per 100,000 on 11 September to 47.5 per 100,000 people on 11 October).

We are therefore urging local people to redouble their efforts to prevent the spread of Coronavirus and help keep local rates down, which could prevent Southend-on-Sea being moved into tier two, either through a proactive request for more restrictions, or being told to by the Government.

Weekly Briefing on Local Decisions & Actions re Coronavirus outbreak – 16th October 2020

Key updates/actions

Local COVID-alert tiers – Essex County Council will move into HIGH alert level tomorrow (17th). Southend-on-Sea will remain in MEDIUM alert and has not yet made a request to move tiers, but remains concerned at the rising rate of infection and has urged the local community to intensify efforts to prevent the spread.

Local COVID-alert information is now available on the Council website and will be regularly updated to reflect the current position: www.southend.gov.uk/covidalert

National information on the COVID-alert levels is available on GOV.UK

Travelling and mixing between different alert tier areas: Information on this has been published on the Council website.

Coronavirus case data: This is published on the Council website and now also includes the daily 7 day rate of positive cases per 100,000. As of 15th, this rate was 51.9 per 100,000.

Test and Trace support payment: People on a means-tested benefit and a low income who are advised by NHS Test and Trace to self-isolate, but are unable to work from home and will lose income as a result, will be eligible for the test and trace support payment scheme. This will be a one off £500 payment.

NHS COVID-19 app: The Council are continuing to promote the national launch of the NHS COVID-19 app across a variety of channels. Residents across the country are being urged to download it and help protect themselves and their loved ones.

A link to the national NHS Digital information shows information by time intervals (for example, 3-days, 7-days, 30-days, etc), as well as the total numbers and requests or referrals to NHS 111.
