DAVID LINDSAY-ABAIRE is a Pulitzer Prize winning playwright, screenwriter, lyricist and librettist. His most recent play, Ripcord, opens this fall at Manhattan Theatre Club. His previous play Good People premiered on Broadway, was awarded the New York Drama Critics Circle Award for Best Play, The Horton Foote Prize, The Edgerton Foundation New American Play, Award, and two Tony nominations. His play Rabbit Hole received the Pulitzer Prize for Drama, five Tony nominations, and the Spirit of America Award. David also wrote the book and lyrics for Shrek the Musical, which was nominated for eight Tonys, four Oliviers, a Grammy, and earned David the Ed Kleban Award as America's most promising musical theatre lyricist. David's other plays include Fuddy Meers, Kimberly Akimbo, Wonder of the World and A Devil Inside, among others. In addition to his work in theatre, David's screen credits include his film adaptation of Rabbit Hole, Dreamworks' Rise of the Guardians, and the upcoming Family Fang, starring Nicole Kidman, Christopher Walken and Jason Bateman.

ROB ASHFORD won the 2012 Olivier Award for his production of Anna Christie starring Jude Law and Ruth Wilson at London's Donmar Warehouse. The production opened to rave reviews with The Independent's anointing it as "picture perfect" and David Benedict stating that "the production's hallmark is its boldness." Rob most recently directed the Broadway revival of Cat on a Hot Tin Roof starring Scarlett Johansson, and Macbeth with Sir Kenneth Branagh at New York's Park Avenue Armory and The Manchester International Festival. The Telegraph claimed "This is a Macbeth that won't just go down as a highlight of the Manchester International Festival but as one of the Scottish Play's great revivals," and Ben Brantley of the New York Times proclaimed "Mr. Ashford uses his experience as a celebrated director of musicals to stunning, time-bending effect." Rob received his 8th Tony Nomination for his work on the Broadway revival of Evita starring Ricky Martin, and received the Tony Award for his work on the Broadway production of Thoroughly Modern Millie. Other Broadway credits include How to Succeed in Business (Tony Award Nominations for his direction and choreography), Promises, Promises (Tony Award Nomination), Shrek, John Water's Cry Baby (Tony Award nomination, Drama Desk, Outer Critics Circle, and Fred Astaire Awards), Curtains (Tony Award nomination), and Wedding Singer (Tony Award nomination). In London, Rob also directed the highly acclaimed Olivier Award winning revivals of A Streetcar Named Desire starring Rachel Weisz and Parade at The Donmar Warehouse. Rob did the choreography and staging for last year's Academy Awards with Seth MacFarlane and won the 2009 Emmy Award for Best Choreography for his work on Baz Luhrmann's production number (featuring Hugh Jackman and Beyoncé) at the 81st Annual Academy Awards. He has also choreographed the opening number for The Tony Awards starring Neil Patrick Harris for the past 4 years. He choreographed the feature film Beyond The Sea directed by and starring Academy Award winner Kevin Spacey and Walt Disney Production's upcoming film Cinderella directed by Kenneth Branagh. Most recently, Rob directed and choreographed NBC's The Sound of Music Livel, for which he received a DGA Award Nomination, and this January directed The Barber of Seville at Chicago Lyric Opera. Rob is an Associate Director at The Old Vic Theatre. He also serves on the Executive Board of The Society of Stage Directors and Choreographers and is a Trustee of The Joyce Theatre in New York City.

Letter from the Chair

We are all so excited to be performing this production of *Shrek the Musical* in the Mercury Theatre, after originally planning to do so back in 2019, before the pandemic put a pause on all theatre plans. The big bright beautiful world of Shrek is very different to our January 2022 production of The Hunchback of Notre Dame, which won us best musical in the North Essex Theatre Guild awards, though they both highlight the idea that true heroes and true love come in unexpected forms and places.

As an amateur society we rely on audience support through ticket sales, and these have been hugely impacted by the pandemic and the cost of living crisis. Our performers, management team and backstage crew are all volunteers and members of the local community, who give their time and talent for free, as they love being able to bring great theatre to you. To reduce costs without impacting on your experience as an audience member, we have not used a live orchestra for this production. This has meant cast have been able to rehearse to fully orchestrated versions of the score to make sure they time their dialogue and songs precisely.

Shrek is a comedy and we are aware the show contains many jokes about height in relation to the villain of the show, Lord Farquaad. These jokes, and the humour of the character being played by someone taller on their knees, are key parts of the musical, as written, but this does not reflect our views about the height or size of any individuals. The humour is context specific to a fairytale world and a fairytale villain, who thinks he is (and wants to be) better than everyone else. All are welcome to be part of our Society and every person involved is valued – from chorus parts to lead roles, from crew members, props team, make-up and wardrobe team to stage managers, committee members, directors and musical directors. All make invaluable contributions to bring you musical theatre magic. I would like to take this opportunity to thank everyone involved in this production for their time, energy, hard-work, commitment, and support towards the Society. Co-ordinating and watching everything come together through this teamwork is an honour.

Adam Woodhouse, Director / Choreographer

Adam joined COS in the 1980s for their productions of 'Brigadoon', 'Carousel', 'The Sound of Music' and 'The Pirates of Penzance' before returning to play Fagin in the 2019 Mercury collaboration production of 'Oliver!' He was also a founding member of CO2, performing in 'Grease', "The Wiz' and 'The Boyfriend'. He trained in Musical Theatre at Laine Theatre Arts before embarking on a performing career that took him all over the world, including lead roles in: 'The Boyfriend', 'The King & I', 'Copacabana', 'Aspects of Love,' 'Sweet Charity', 'Funny Girl', 'Singin' in the Rain', 'Fiddler on the Roof' and 'Annie' 'Get Your Gun'. He was also Resident Director on the UK tour of 'The Pirates of Penzance', starring Paul Nicholas. Adam, now spends his time directing and choreographing shows and concerts, visiting drama schools

as an audition coach, and teaching dance. For COS, he directed and choreographed '42nd Street', 'Annie' and 'The Hunchback of Notre Dame'. For CO2, he choreographed 'Guys & Dolls', and directed and choreographed 'West Side Story', 'Legally Blonde' and 'The Wizard of Oz'. Adam has thoroughly enjoyed working with COS again on 'Shrek' and would like to thank Laura & Neil for their support throughout the process – he couldn't have done it without them.

Laura graduated from Colchester Institute with a BA(hons)Degree in Musical Theatre. Nid you know...?

- "Shrek" is derived from the words "Shrek Lekh", a Yiddish word meaning awful or terrible, and "Schrecklich" which means dreadful in German.
- Shrek The Musical was nominated for eight Tony Awards, twelve Drama Desk Awards and a Grammy for Best Musical Show Album, and went on to win two awards for costume design - a Tony Award and a Drama Desk Award.
- Shrek is one of only 17 fictional characters on the Hollywood Walk of Fame!
- The story of Shrek is based on a children's book "Shrek!" by William Steig.
- The original production cost \$24 million, which meant that, at the time, it was the most expensive musical to open on Broadway!
- The film of Shrek won the very first award for Best Animated Feature in 2000.
- The show itself contains references to several other musicals, including Wicked, Chicago, The Lion King, Gypsy, Les Miserables, Once Upon a Mattress, RENT, A Chorus Line, Evita, and Dreamgirls – can you spot them!?
- Shrek The Musical closed on Broadway in January 2010, after 441 performances and 37 previews over 12 months and premiered in the West End at the Drury Lane Theatre, where it ran from 2011 to 2013.


