Asbury Theological Seminary President Timothy Tennent cautioned against calling the event a revival, instead preferring the term "Asbury Awakening." "I think it is wise to see this, at the current phase, as an awakening," he wrote in a recent blog post. "Only if we see lasting transformation which shakes the comfortable foundations of the church and truly brings us all to a new and deeper place can we look back, in hindsight and say 'yes, this has been a revival."

<u>In a letter to parents</u>, Asbury University President Kevin Brown called the event a "beautiful, historic moment of spiritual renewal."

Fletcher Chapel is uniquely designed for the celebration of Eucharist. Take note of the table in the middle of the room. The room serves best as a sacred space for a communal practice of feasting at the Lord's table and a worshipful space for prayer.

The prayer garden is adjacent to Fletcher Chapel and can be accessed through Fletcher or from the outside of the building.

10. Prayer Garden

Outside the Fletcher Chapel is a small prayer garden built in memory of Lanny Carroll Spears II (late son of staff member Lanny Spears).

Notice the small labyrinth painted on the ground. If you are unfamiliar with the labyrinth as a spiritual symbol, read the short explanation of the labyrinth on the door leading out to the garden.

Moreover, the Collegiate Day of Prayer: 40-Day Prayer Guide, lists many members of the New Apostolic Reformation as contributing authors including Lou Engle. [xvi] Other members of the NAR that connect with this event include worship leaders from the International House of Prayer (IHOP). [xviii] Also, Allen Hood, M.Div. from Asbury Seminary serves as the Associate Director of IHOP. [xviii] Francis Chan publicly endorses the NAR. [xix] Also, Andy Roman says, Rick Warren of the Emergent Church Movement went to Asbury Seminary "to spread the revival to 20 million students on 4,300 college campuses." [xx] Before his retirement, Rick Warren promoted hard ecumenicalism, as he combined Catholicism, Islam, and evangelical traditions. [xxi] It is clear that all religions are merging and this includes mystical tradition, which Revelation 17 calls Mystery Babylon.

The word "awakening" is a word that is used actively within New Age... which gives me a "warning signal" when I read it in a "revival context"...!

Tonight we're celebrating the 200th year anniversary of the Collegiate Day of Prayer.

200 years ago, 1823, coming out of the Second Great Awakening - a move of God that swept through the New England's college campuses.

Where at that time students would come into college barely knowing and walking with God and the Spirit of God would encounter entire generations of students, where by the time, students would graduate; they're spiritually formed, marked by the Gospel and launched into wholehearted pursuit ministry missions. And the mothers and fathers of that day, their prayer was "Father, what You did in the previous generation, Father would you do it again in the next generation?". 

Canadian revivalist Todd Bentley, leader of the "Lakeland Outpouring," was commissioned as an evangelist last night in a special ceremony in Lakeland, Fla.,

that was broadcast into millions of homes by God TV.

California pastors Ché Ahn and Bill Johnson, along with Canadian pastor John Arnott, laid hands on the 32-year-old Bentley while Peter Wagner, leader of the International Coalition of Apostles, read a statement about the need for apostolic alignment. Other prominent leaders from the apostolic and prophetic movements stood on the platform to show their support for Bentley and to endorse the revival, which began in early April and is now in its 83rd day of continuous meetings.

The ceremony, held in a 10,000-seat tent, took place after some charismatic leaders raised questions about Bentley's claims, methods and theology. They asked Wagner to oversee a dialogue, and he responded by organizing Monday evening's event so that Bentley could have more accountability—

or what Wagner calls "apostolic alignment."

"I believe last night was truly historic and a true sign of unity," Bentley told Charisma today. "Many streams converged and I know last night's commissioning will truly help bring God's outpouring to a much larger part of the body."

Participating leaders at the ceremony included Wagner; Ahn, pastor of Harvest Rock Church in Pasadena, Calif.; John Arnott of Toronto Airport Christian Fellowship in Canada; Bill Johnson, pastor of Bethel Church in Redding, Calif.; and Rick Joyner, founder of MorningStar Ministries in Charlotte, N.C.

Wagner said to Bentley on the platform: "This commissioning represents a powerful spiritual transaction taking place in the invisible world. With this in mind, I take the apostolic authority that God has given me and I decree to Todd Bentley, your power will increase, your authority will increase, your favor will increase, your influence will increase, your revelation will increase.

"I also decree that a new supernatural strength will flow through this ministry. A new life force will penetrate this move of God. Government will be established to set things in their proper order. God will pour out a higher level of discernment to distinguish truth from error. New relationships will surface to open the gates to the future."

In a newsletter released earlier this week, Bentley said Wagner was the one who suggested having an official ceremony in which Bentley could be commissioned.



And we're asking God; anoint us. Everybody put your hand on your chest. Father would you anoint us with radical humility. Father, teach us how to go low, as Your Son went low. Give us eyes to see the beauty of Your Son's humility. Make us like Jesus, that we would walk how He walked and talk how He talked. That we would have the aroma of Jesus to a lost and dying world.







It appears to be someone named Bill Elliff. I had sent over an updated list on the CDOP participants to Lighthouse Trails over time, as it is not only the speakers but a lot of the music people and people on stage who were identified over time, which seemed to help paint fuller picture of participants.

When noting one of the rare times the Asbury "Revival" and the CDOP event were mentioned and connected, the following was written up:

One of the last speakers at the CDOP event February 23rd in Hughes Auditorium at Asbury University was Bill Elliff, National Engage pastor at the Summit Church Little Rock. He claims to have "been a student of God's revival moments across history for 50 years,", who traveled for several years to churches helping them pursue God in revival. He is also "a founding member of the OneCry initiative that seeks to help pastors and churches pursue God for revival and spiritual awakening." That initiative is one of the contributors to the Collegiate Day of Prayer Movement, which seems to focus on revival and awakening in many of the related articles.

Per his February 11 blog entry entitled Reflections from Asbury, he and his wife decided the previous day – – or just two days after the initial Wednesday chapel event – – to travel to Asbury:

"Many are asking me what I'm observing, though, so I would give these cursory thoughts. Heaven records the full reality. 1. This is real. God is very present." On February 17, he posted the following: https://billelliff.org/blogs/news/reflections-from-asbury-part-6

"What if God intends to save the next generation? To redeem them from the clutches of our culture and set them ablaze for His missionary purposes? And what if Asbury is the beginning in our day?"

"Ten years ago, a group of 50 Christian leaders met in Atlanta for a day to ask a question: What can we do to cooperate with God to help foster revival and awakening? The leaders of the OneCry initiative had convened this meeting, and the men in the room were well-known leaders who all shared a burning passion for the movement of God. We longed to see the next Great Awakening."

"As we began that day, we went around the room, introducing ourselves by sharing when it was that each of us developed a passion for revival. As each man spoke, the vast majority traced the birth of this passion from one source: The Jesus Movement in the early 1970s. It had changed their lives and forever put a taste under their tongue for God's presence. In the spiritual fires of that visitation from God, we had all realized that more could be accomplished in five minutes of God's presence than 50 years of our best human effort."

"Last night I was invited back to my alma mater, Ouachita Baptist University in Arkansas, to speak about what I had observed at Asbury during my recent visit. I was a freshman at OBU in 1970. On one day in the spring of 1970, God came in unusual power at a student-led noon service. The 15-minute service continued through the afternoon. All classes were canceled. Hundreds of students were overwhelmed by the manifest presence of God. God moved through that crowd that grew throughout the day, changing lives. Testimonies erupted of repentance, people clearing their consciences with those they'd wronged, salvation, humility, and brokenness.

"I stood and spoke to students last night in the small chapel where that occurred and suddenly realized that day had completely changed the trajectory of my life. As a student, the next 50+ years of life and ministry were dramatically shaped by an encounter with the manifest presence of God during a season of revival and awakening."

With all of that as prelude, nine days after the February chapel and six days before a certain event, Elliff printed the following:

"It is absolutely no coincidence that for over a year, the nationwide broadcast for the Collegiate Day of Prayer has been scheduled to be livestreamed from Hughes Auditorium on the campus of Asbury University this Thursday, February 23rd.

"Next Thursday, what is happening in the sacred spot of God's visitation will be opened to everyone. Believers and churches will adopt the 4,196 American colleges and universities nationwide for laser-focused prayer. You and your church or campus can adopt a campus and join this 2-hour livestream from the auditorium in Asbury here: https://collegiatedayofprayer.org/. Gather your church or campus to watch and pray. (Please take time to read of the amazing history of God's revivals on campuses here: https://collegiatedayofprayer.org/about/history/. It will give great perspective to you regarding what is happening right now.)

"What if millions of believers united on this one day to pray for God to visit every campus with an extraordinary movement of God's Spirit that produced extraordinary results?"

"The providence of God has provided this. And, adding further fuel to God's fire, the "Jesus Revolution" movie (produced by Jon Erwin, whose father was radically changed by the Jesus Movement) premiers across America the very next day (February 24th). It will be seen by millions.

"God is out to save a generation. Will we cooperate? Will we pray?"

Again, after proclaiming "this is real" on February 11, he then spoke about it being "absolutely no coincidence" that the CDOP event has been scheduled there for over a year.

QUESTION #2

But at first glance... he seems only to be an elder

So... would you categorize him as involved with NAR apostles and prophets?

Is he self-proclaimed apostle or prophet?

Or "just" involved within Word Faith Movement?

REPLY #2

I don't know about that, not only because what I have had time to look up on Elliff has been largely summed up by some of the material below, but because it appears that while some involved may fall into the camp mentioned, others might not be identified that way specifically.

As with many of the issues with what is discussed on the Lighthouse Trails site, one issue could be a group or groups with problematic doctrine having an active push towards new age / emergent / contemplative etc. things, while other groups could've been seen more strongly evangelical at one point (maybe years, decades, or centuries ago) but may not seem to be sufficiently on guard against problematic doctrine (and might already have some problematic doctrine of their own). There may be evidence of that present amidst the different parties involved.

From my perspective, there actually appear to be at least two main prongs of those who ultimately were involved. Both prongs seem to want and/or push for "revival" and "awakening". One prong would be the IHOP type camp. The other prong would be those seeking "revival"/"awakening" from the Wesleyan and / or "Holiness" tradition.

An interview below in which some of the differences are highlighted points out that the Wesleyan and Holiness movement isn't necessarily charismatic/Pentecostal. However, there may seem to be a confluence of movement/doctrinal outlooks that may have markings that are similar in some cases with some individuals.

That also seems to manifest in what some of the students expressed as far as talking of seeing signs, apparently saying that God told them or showed them something, or seeming to characterize what they claim to have heard in a way that didn't seem to be allowing for qualifiers. That could include seeming to give the impression that they were being led a certain way but actually indicating that they thought God was directly telling them something, even in using specific words that they repeated like it happened perhaps in a conversational manner.

One example would be a member of the gospel choir who talked about her family background related to the Salvation Army. There's an example of an organization that not only reportedly came from the Holiness movement but over time evidently has been more and more open to more of the New Age, contemplative, emergent, mystical influences as noted by Lighthouse Trails etc.

Going to the second prong of the influencers, something that seemed apparent was that those affiliated with Asbury, either through the college/university or through the associated Asbury Theological Seminary across the street.

One area of crossover is the IHOP, charismatic contingent that also may study at the University or more prominently, at Asbury Theological Seminary. Someone who appears to travel in both circles as it were is Ruben Cervantes. You may know him from the collegiate day of prayer video as the guy with glasses who was the primary music leader with the acoustic guitar:

Per the above, Ruben Cervantes is both a high level employee in IHOP but an Asbury Theological Seminary graduate, who according to his website is close to obtaining his PhD from there, and whose related "research is on Revival and Spiritual Awakening". Here he is singing with that person evidently from IHOP who was seen on camera through much of the collegiate day of prayer who then seemed to go into shouting and screaming leading into what IHOP's Allen Hood then said there:

(There was a further breakdown done of many of the different participants like Hood and some singers as well as song and artist listing if there are further people unidentified from the event on your end.)

Cervantes was also evidently endorsed on one early podcast as somebody seemingly whose thoughts needed to get out further; this endorsement was by JD Walt, one of the heads of what I'd call the second prong of the Wesleyan-Holiness movement connected with the "Asbury community" (as it was called by university president Kevin Brown). If you're not yet familiar with JD Walt, David Thomas, and their associated groups Seedbed, New Room, and so forth, they and several in these orgs reportedly not only have been actively pushing towards goals of revival and awakening, but basically deployed to this event reportedly within hours of it starting. They then began to "shepherd" the event in certain ways, all of which is still being documented and cataloged in hopes for sharing an overall timeline and picture of events and participants.

All that is to illustrate how much crossover there has become between groups and contingencies. Anyhow, this recently came out and gives more information in part of the mindset of somebody who was front and center on the stage for the collegiate day of prayer. Below are some excerpts from a podcast Cervantes recently appeared in giving his perspective —— it appears there is a YouTube transcript along with the video. All of this seems quite noteworthy given his prominent place at the collegiate day prayer event (including per the video, directing people to get into groups and say/pray on certain things) and his reported connections with many people involved:

Also, after mentioning February 8 chapel speaker Zach Meerkreebs and potentially indicating having known him, he then talks about "my other friend, Georges Dumaine, he was leading a gospel choir" at the same chapel. I only recently learned about this person, and if you're not familiar with Dumaine, his role seems quite remarkable in retrospect — especially from the perspective that any retelling and contextualizing of the events of February 8th that seeks to present an honest, accurate picture would have done well to discuss his role and his background as a matter of forthrightness. That a grand total of zero people have appeared to sufficiently contextualized Dumaine's presence there in all of the narratives I have read to this date is what is remarkable.

Note that what is being presented has been cast as "the story behind Asbury revival", a title which seems to keep coming up in various ways and figures to likely continue as different figures come forward giving their version of things — and perhaps joining that to further things that might be on the person's mind, as in this case.

"Bob" also provided the transcript from the Live Broadcast at Asbury on February 23, 2023:

I felt inspired to include it – in case someone is interested to read it...

The people at Lighthouse Trails indicated you were interested in more details and information about Asberry. Rather than forwarding stuff I'd sent a while ago, much of which has had to be updated, I'm happy to set an along the information and links encountered thus far. Much of what I've already sent over there is already outdated and has needed to be updated as more information has come out or been found, such as the following regarding the CDOP event:

This does not purport to be a complete transcript, but much has been attempted to be transcribed. This attempts to identify participants despite the reported decision (notably after national and international headlines were already secured) to pivot away from what had been planned with Warren, Chan, etc. to something where names were not highlighted – – save of course, for Asbury university and the Collegiate Day of Prayer (as well as Asbury University president Dr. Kevin Brown and Luke18 / IHOP / CDOP's Thai Lam via the TBN broadcast.

Also, multiple people on the stage and thus on camera during the event had IHOPU shirts (one in particular was on camera for an extended period of time), and one also had a KC cap that might relate to Lam's IHOPKC. this latest update comes right after learning that one of the most prominent music/"worship" leaders present for this event appears to be Ruben Cervantes, who is both a high level employee in IHOP but an Asbury theological seminary graduate, who according to his website is close to obtaining his PhD from there, and whose related "research is on Revival and Spiritual Awakening".

Another singer evidently involved with IHOP — who had a particularly expressive performance, particularly what sounded like shouting screaming at the end of one music section that led into the comments of Allen Hood — has just apparently been identified: Amariah Mello Alonge. She initially seemed to be one of the college students given her age and prominence on the stage, who was in the camera shots of many of the speakers, as she stood there rocking back-and-forth for most of the event.

Additional related comments and observations are planned (and some seeped into this already), but it seemed appropriate to document this event, especially given certain comments of the Asbury University president and others.

From CDOP simulcast, the wording on the video says 'Collegiate Day of Prayer Broadcast: For Revival and Awakening on College Campuses / LIVE FROM ASBURY UNIVERSITY'

The first song on that being played was Rest On Us by Maverick City featuring UPPERROOM. Maverick City has also collaborated with Elevation Music (reportedly connected with Furtick's Elevation Church), next was Worthy of It All by David Brymer; next was Be Enthroned by Bethel Music; next was All Hail King Jesus by Jeremy Riddle (per Wiki, of Bethel Music) — at this point, a video feed from Hughes auditorium comes in; rapid clapping accompanies this song.

It is noteworthy that the last two songs appear to be led by one of the people that continued to sing February 8 — and then was shown later on stage in the initial Asbury Collegian article from the middle of the stage singing — who later appeared to be at the top middle of the stage for most if not all of the rest of the evening. Before the video came on, I had a feeling that it might be the same person.

It seems noteworthy that this person was in the center of things on February 8 and apparently likes to continue to sing for extended periods, which may well have be one of the influences of why things may have run a little over at the time in question, as the chapel video appears to indicate. During the set of songs that were played before the speaker on the Wednesday, February 8 chapel service, this person took the lead vocal, proceeded to move to the front and center of the stage, and the song lasted approximately 10 minutes.

The two songs he appeared to sing at the February 23rd event covered approximately 13 minutes, much of which appear to be repetitions of a handful of words with gospel variations, which also does not appear to be something out of the ordinary but would understandably be practiced and gone over multiple times. (Aside: this is noted in particular as far as what was being considered a sign of "revival" which actually is often a mark of many singers and programs, especially those associated with music programs who want to hone and maintain their skills on an ongoing basis.)

May update: it was upon going through the video from the Shane Claiborne interview February 12, or four days after the Wednesday February chapel service, that a name was finally put to the performer of Georges Dumaine:

Lena Marlowe, one of the gospel choir who was spotlighted as such at the collegiate day of prayer event, said the following in the February 12 video: "Madeleine Black who's actually the chapel coordinator, she told Ben Black who's her husband, director of gospel choir, to come up with a song of response for the end. And we did 'Goodness of God', and it was me and Georges Dumaine and Sarah Cauley (sp). And I'm not highlighting these names for any glory, but just to just be specific." (Also appears that Ben Black was the accompanist on the piano to the three of them.)

It appears that the person, Georges Dumaine, at the time of the February 8th chapel and the CDOP in the same space was a 37-year old father of five who had been an IHOP Jax worship leader and moved to KC to join the IHOPKC Night Watch:

There are numerous Twitter accounts, many of which name check or repost stuff from Mike Bickle, with other posts speaking of "revival". He even has of Twitter/Instagram post from 2013 in which he shows his staff badge for IHOP. His Facebook page had IHOPKC / Luke18 / CDOP figure Thai Lam listed near of the top of the initial friends page when I first saw it, with many other IHOP / YWAM associated figures friended. Another prominent figure from the CDOP whom he friended is Asbury Theological Seminary grad student and high-level IHOP staffer Ruben Cervantes.

There were also many Asbury Theological Seminary friends, and though he reportedly lived in Kansas City for the better part of the last decade and is now listed at an address in Orlando, he sang this past December 2022 at an Asbury theological seminary program as a featured singer. Notably on the list of recent friends is the aforementioned Madeleine Black, the coordinator of chapel at Asbury University. Another recent friend is Mark Swayze, pastor at the Woodlands Methodist Church which is reportedly associated with New Room / Awakening Project / Seedbed and so forth.

The next song was Your Praise Will Ever Be on My Lips by "Ever Be by Bethel Music". It appears that one of the other of the three singers onstage at the end of February 8 chapel is the singer here. Next is Another Wave (Of Rival) by Lindy Cofer (some sites say Linda Conant) and Circuit Rider music, who appears to be connected with YWAM missions. Some of the musicians do not appear to be students seen here before, and might be some of the promised musicians per their February 1 CDOP announcement "from International House of Prayer, Circuit Riders + Black Voices Movement (BVM), and Met By Love Worship". One of these that didn't look like a student seen before encourages the crowd to sing the lyrics "tsunamis of revival".

What appeared to follow was the chorus of How Great is Your Love by Phil Wickham, who per Wiki "attends Harvest Christian Fellowship and his pastor is Greg Laurie." No other lyrics but "how great is your love" were repeated over and over, which had been proceeded by "the King is coming" sung over and over. This was followed by the words "we crown you King of glory" sung repeatedly — 17 times, in fact — with no discernible corresponding song attached. (Upon checking the video of the singer with a BVM performance from a month ago, it appears to me to be the same singer.)

Another one of the singers — now evidently identified as IHOP's Ruben Cervantes — who sings many songs during this and don't recall seeing before references Psalm 24 and starts singing repeatedly "we open up the gates, let the King of glory enter in". Then he starts to sing "Lord we need you, Lord we want you" repeatedly, evidently inviting the students to join in with "could we just tell him this?" and then singing the same words over and over. As people sing along to that he eventually transitions to "(we say) highest praises, Lord of all" sung repeatedly, which apparently goes back to the Bethel Music "Be Enthroned" song. This makes way to I / We Exalt Thee by Jesus Culture, which per Wiki "is a Christian revivalist youth oriented organization that was formed at the Bethel Church".

He then goes back to a repetition of "we exalt Thee".

At this point, the 45 minute counter to the start of the event has elapsed, and he asks the crowd "would you sing we exalt Thee?" The dirge-like chant with closed eyes of "we exalt thee" goes on until a young unidentified guy (who appears per other news reports to be Asbury University student Canaan Yan) comes out and sounds possibly on the verge of tears, asks people to look around them and asks them "aren't you so grateful to be here?" He thanks Jesus: "we are so thankful that You have orchestrated all of these. None of us of have foreseen this from happening but Jesus, it's only You, and only You can do it."

After that person finishes, onto the stage comes Asbury University president Dr. Kevin Brown.

I want to extend a welcome to you this evening, welcoming the students that are here in the space, welcoming all of the students across the country who are participating online. It is my privilege this evening to provide some context to what's been happening in the space over the last couple of weeks. On February 8, right here, a regularly scheduled chapel service never ended.

(Applause break)

And in addition to students here, in addition to students across the street, colleges and universities representing over 200 schools, students flocking in from all over the country have joined with us over the last couple of weeks. And other guests have come from every region of the United States, and even from pockets from the world, and I just want to say: This. Was. Not. Planned. (Laughter, smiles)

This was not a function of an innovative state of the art facility. It was not a function of a slick marketing scheme. There was no

program planning committee, and it's not because of celebrities or professional musicians. This has been a nameless, titleless movement, and tonight will be no different.

(Applause, noises like whooping; also, in the TBN simulcast, as he says that, his name and title are put up there as "Dr. Kevin Brown, President of Asbury University", though the CDOP simulcast complies with the reportedly nameless and titleless theme.)

So many, so many have humbly endeavored to consistently elevate Jesus Christ as the focal point. And the atmosphere and the spirit of the space is reminiscent of those characteristics we see in James chapter 3: pure, peaceable gentle, willing to yield, full of mercy, full of fruit, no partiality, no hypocrisy. And consistent with other stories, I am a first-hand witness of **radical humility**, of humanizing compassion, raw confession and honesty, a self-emptying consecration, and life-altering commitment.

What started with students has over just a couple of weeks swell to thousands upon thousands of hungry hearted guests. What has happened here — what is happening here — is truly extraordinary. The selflessness displayed by many to create space at the table has been inspiring, one of the most inspiring things I have ever seen in my entire life. The collective godliness, the hospitable goodwill. Unparalleled. And importantly, we are seeing this spiritual fire beginning to flare in a variety of other spaces. (turns page of binder on lectern.)

But please, hear this. Please hear this: the trajectory of renewal is always deeper. The trajectory of renewal is always outward. Discipleship, habituating practices that make us more like Christ; the missional instinct to bend the universe in favor of our neighbor, in favor of the widow, in favor of the orphan, in favor of the alien. The compulsion to bear witness to a different king and to a different kingdom, and the political statement that Jesus is Lord. (Applause break).

The trajectory is a holy life, virtuous and pure, expressed in neighbor serving, God-honoring work. Oh Lord, make us different, give us different eyes, help us to see like Jesus, give us a different heart. Help us to love and to live like Christ — for the fullest realization of our humanity, and the fullest edification of the communities that we inhabit, and the common good, and ultimately for God's glory, the glorification of God; Amen.

TBN screen says "Thai Lam, executive Director – Luke 18 project and international House of prayer KC" Welcome, welcome, welcome, welcome, to celebrate the 200th year anniversary of the collegiate day of prayer. (Applause break.)

200 years ago, 1823, coming out of the second great awakening, a move of God that swept through the New England college campuses, where at that time, students would come into college barely knowing and walking with God. And the Spirit of God would encounter entire generations of students where by the time students would graduate, they were spiritually formed, marked by the Gospel, and launched into a whole hearted pursuit of ministry, missions. And the mothers and fathers of that day, their prayer was Father, what you did in the previous generation, Father would you do it again in the next generation?

In 1823, every major denomination and every university campus in America adopted the last Thursday of February as united, multi-generational day of prayer for revival and spiritual awakening on college campuses. And today, we're standing in the wake of 200 year old prayers.

(Applause break; it is noteworthy that it appears one of the people that continued to sing February 8 and then was shown later on stage in the initial article in the middle of the stage singing is standing and has just put his arms up during this at the top middle of the stage)

And as we're, I guess we're just beholding all that the Lord has done here at Asbury, I believe that we are standing in the wake of the prayers of mothers and fathers. And as we are, as we're looking to what God is doing in this moment, I believe that there is a divine invitation for us to pray the same prayer: Father, do it again. Father, do it again.

(Applause)

This moment... to be here for the collegiate day of prayer. We've been planning this for probably two years now, and we planned to be here last May. And just in the Lord's providence, He wanted for us to have this moment of prayer coming out of 15 days of nonstop worship, prayer, confession, repentance and beholding Jesus. And as we start our evening, I want to read to us out of Philippians 2, because the spirit of what God's been doing here these past 15 days has been one of **radical humility** and beholding Jesus.

(Reads Phil 2:1-11) (Applause)

Someone unidentified comes up, which upon checking appears to be Dr. Timothy Tennent, president of Asbury Theological Seminary

Join me in prayer, shall we: gracious and beautiful Father we come before you basking anew in the power and the promise of the gospel, the glorious gospel. And Lord, for these past 16 days, you have met us here and reminding the world that You are the risen Lord. And we pray tonight and we dedicate this night to You to ignite a fire throughout this country, through You and in the world. Lord you have visited Gen Z, You have awakened this generation. He is with you; He is with you in your coming and your going and your weeping and rejoicing. He is with you.

And may God use you to bring every school in every university and every ministry in this nation that He touched in a supernatural way. So we commit, Lord, these hours of prayer to you. Awaken us from casual prayer and domesticated Christianity and culturally compromised churches. And Lord, ignite a fire across this nation and the world, we pray. Hallelujah. In Jesus' name. Amen.

(Applause, piano starts; Hillsong music's, King of Kings is played)
(someone says we are collecting the students from Asbury, and four students read some verses with piano in background)

(Applause)

Alison Perfater (name not on screen, but is on the screen in the document around the Collegiate Day of Prayer website video recently uploaded, as well as being noted as being student body president in the video of the Wednesday, February 8 chapel service)

Well, a lifetime wouldn't be long enough to talk about what God has started here but I'll do the best I can under three minutes. Yeah, I mean, on Wednesday, February 8, a very small but very faithful group of Asbury students listened to the nudging of the Holy Spirit and stayed in chapel a little longer, and then a little longer, and then way longer, and we had no idea that the world was about to know God better.

(Applause)

And we had no idea that we and our campus was about to become a mission field. And we had no idea the things that God was going to do — and we still don't, but hundreds have come to know Christ for the first time. And thousand have come to re-commit their lives and their hearts to the Christian faith. And so we celebrate that tonight, and we join together in prayer tonight, and just acknowledge this is not the result of some remarkably spiritual environment, but that the Spirit has descended upon us because He wanted to, and we're so thankful.

And some of you might be thinking this is like the grand finale or or the the last night of revival, but I just want to encourage you to think again, because this is this is the beginning and... (Applause)

The Holy Spirit is not going anywhere, and in His word, He says — it says now the Lord is the Spirit and where the Spirit of the Lord is, there is liberty. And while this revival has been a ridiculously unique experience, I just also want to say that like, this is the reality of our lives as believers, and like this is Christians being Christians. And so I welcome you to this collegiate night of prayer. I welcome you to the last official service of this revival, but I welcome you to the rest of our lives abiding in Christ.

(Applause, then the "we exalt Thee" singer — Ruben Cervantes — plays the song How great is our God by Chris Tomlin, then what seems to be a break when the singer says "let's just get into small groups". It appeared that in one of the small groups, the school president's wife is present.)

(Next is Ruben Cervantes singing To Worship You I Live by Matt Gillman)

Thai Lam:

We want to invite you tonight if you're wanting prayer, we're opening up the altars here. These ones — so,e of them have been praying here afternoon and evening, day after day. And so if there's something in your heart that you want prayer for, you want breakthrough, freedom, or you want to come to Jesus, feel free to make your way to the altar.

Tonight as we continue in prayer, as of this moment, there's been 4614 campus ministries, churches, and individuals who adopted 4200 college campuses and, thank you Jesus. What would it be like if every college campus had three, 5, 10 churches, ministries that are covering and saturating these campuses in prayer. I wanna invite you — would you pull out your phone, go to collegiatedayofprayer.org. We wanna invite you to adopt a campus that's near your home, that you go to school at, a campus near your heart and one that's unengaged in the gospel. We would love to see 10,000 ministries, churches, individuals adopting every campus. And so we're believing God that the Lord would raise up down the street from these campuses friends that believe in God for revival and spiritual awakening.

New guy, appears to be college student

Hello. Y'all this has been good; this has real powerful, y'all. Well, we're a couple college students from UK and EKU and we've been tasked with saying some of our life verses tonight...

Zeke Atha, Asbury student (who was also one of the people present giving announcements at the Wednesday February 8 chapel service and was listed there as Chapel Intern)

It is the gift of God. God cannot help but give us good gifts. He gives us a beautiful world in which we can worship Him. He gives us His image in which we are made and He gives us the very breath in our lungs — let's take a breath together, breathe in and breathe out. That breath was a gift from God. He is present here, but we see this brokenness in our world, we see the brokenness in our own lives, and we know that sometimes we take the gifts of God and we elevate them above God Himself.

In the garden, the serpent got Adam and Eve to question God's goodness: has God really given the best to you or is He withholding something from you? And when we decided to take something that was less than God and put it above Him, that is what the Bible calls sin. And sin has a cost. The Scriptures say the wages of sin is death, and so when we as Adam and Eve chose to put something — a gift — above God, we inherited death. But God out of his goodness, He continues to give again. And He chooses a solid group of people called the Israelites and He says I'm gonna give you a promised land and I'm gonna give you a law to help you be reminded of how good how holy I am.

But what do we do again? We take the law, we take the promised land, the Israelites take the promised land, and we manipulate it, we control it. We say we can't live up to this standard but we're gonna hold other people to this standard. And the law gives a way for us to be made right. (?) It says if you sacrifice a perfect lamb, a lamb without blemish, the lamb's blood will cover your sin and cleanse you.

But of course, the Israelites and we cannot hold the standard of the law. So God says out of My abundance I'm gonna give you the perfect sacrifice. And His name is Jesus. And like we just read, it's a gift of God, God cannot help but give Himself away.

In Philippians 2:10, He did not count equality with God something to be grasped, but He gave himself away. He poured Himself out in the form of a servant. And as the wages of sin is death, there on that cross, Jesus took the punishment that we deserve because He was the worthy Lamb. He lived the perfect life. He never had a sinful thought. But He took the wrath of God on the cross. We forget that the cross is an instrument of torture — it's all over, it's on the water tower, but thank you, Jesus that He gave it all out of Himself to forgive us our sins. He is the perfect Lamb. He washes our sins away, and not only that, He died but He rose again. He defeated sin and He defeated the grave.

This is the best news. In our church, we've often misconstrued the perfect gift that He gives called eternal life. We think often that eternal life is something we get when we die, but scripture says Jesus said in John 17:3 and this is eternal life that they know You, the true God, and Jesus Christ whom You have sent. Eternal life is not something you inherit only after death, but you can experience the free gift of God today.

And all that he requires from you is that you repent, you turn away from the ways you have elevated things other than God, and you say, God you deserve it all, because You died on the cross, and You rose again giving a free gift of grace. And all we have to do is repent. And my brother Christian, he's going to he's going to give a little glimpse of how God has given a free gift of grace in his own life. So let's give it up for Christian right now.

(Applause)

Christian:

So, Zeke talked about good gifts, the gifts that God gives us. I'm gonna briefly talk about God's gift of kindness which leads to repentance. For the last two weeks, we have been given the gift of God's kindness and have experienced outpouring of His love. As a result of His kindness being poured out, we have experienced **radical humility** and repentance. Repentance is one of the intended outcomes of receiving God's kindness, as we see this in Romans 2:4 which says God's kindness is intended to lead you to repentance. God has been meeting with us in a kind and gentle way that has overwhelmed us with His love in the natural reaction that is repentance. We have seen this since day one. So many students gathered at the altars or in their seats or were confessing sins and turning from ungodly patterns in their life.

Not because of worship, not because of an awesome sermon, sorry Zach, not because of a perfect worded altar call. But because they experienced God's love and kindness which led to repentance, they experienced godly sorrow rather than worldly sorrow. 2 Corinthians 7:10 says godly sorrow brings repentance that leads to salvation and leaves no regret, while worldly sorrow brings death. Practical differences between godly and worldly sorrow is that worldly sorrow is being upset that you got caught, being afraid of the consequences. Wordly sorrow is sadness that does not lead to repentance. But godly sorrow is being broken over grieving the heart of God, caring more about your spiritual condition than the consequences of your sins, being willing to die to self, surrender everything to Him, and generally turn 180° from your sin in a walk towards Him.

I've seen God's kindness lead me to repentance my own life. I shared briefly last week about how God had removed pride of my life just up there (points to balcony). I got to Hughes late, and I was in a bad mood. I wasn't able to sit on the floor, and I had all this pride in my heart. And I felt like God was gently saying to me Christian, is this your fire or is this Mine. And that just broke me. I could just feel God's gentle kindness leading me to that godly sorrow. And I just asked him to kill Christian Alexander in that moment, and that I would die to self. And when I left, I took a picture of my seen saying that was my tombstone, that's where I died just as a reminder. Applause.

But He was gentle in pointing out my pride. And His kind allowed me to have godly sorrow, which led me to turn from my prideful state and die to self. For the last two weeks, we've been lingering in the outpouring of God's love and kindness, and have been changed. My prayer is that we would have our hearts opened to the love and kindness of God, and it will result in experiencing God's healing, and the gentle pointing out of sins, which leads to godly sorrow, genuine repentance, death to self, and a lot of tombstones. (Applause)

Zach Meerkreebs (chapel speaker on February 8):

That's not just good news. That's best news. Good news is when my wife shows up and I missed her. Good news is when there's free Indian food. Best news is Jesus died on the cross for us, amen? And the best news demands a response; what's your response? Over the last couple of weeks, we've had different ways to respond to the outpouring of God's love. so I want to address everyone in the room. anyone in the extension sites, anyone else joining us online. I wanna invite us to respond.

OK? I'm gonna give us three ways to respond, and I'm gonna ask for an action — we're gonna fall to our knees. Wherever you're at, whether... country, wherever, your campus, but we're gonna fall to our knees, but these are three ways we respond. When you experience the love of God, when He confronts you with the love of God, we respond. The first one as we hear, kindness leads us to repentance, some of us need to fall to our knees and repent for our sins.

The second response is you will be on your knees crying out for your campus to be confronted by the love of God, for an outpouring of the love of God; maybe it's your friends maybe you speak of a specific friend. Right now, I think of my friend Keegan.

Maybe it is your family like my family, Miriam; Gary. Maybe it's a nation. Would you fall to knees and cry out for repentance? And then Some of you by Pastor Zeke said, you're ready to give your life to Christ, to repent and believe wherever you're at?

So we're gonna come to our knees now. So go ahead. (People begin to kneel)

We stay focused, we stay focused. So first, first response is that you just feel the need to repent for sins in your life, the second one is your crying out for the outpouring of God's love to lead people to repentance on your campus and your family and the nations or your friends, and some of you come to your knees knowing it's time to repent and believe. Or in some translations, to repent and return. Repentance will refresh your life.

So we're going to have a moment of silence, and then if you're the third option, that you're ready to repent and believe, repent and return and give your life to Jesus, I'm gonna ask you to respond, but let's experience a little bit of silence, and the generosity of the Holy Spirit's voice will whisper to us.

(Silence except baby; piano starts; Christian Alexander and Zeke Atha stand on either side of Zach; keyboard music starts to play in background)

So wherever you're at, thank you for repenting. Holy Spirit, be generous with Your voice and presence right now. Would You lead us to repentance? Thank You for those who are crying out, that outpouring of love that would lead nations, friends, campuses, to repent. But right now, we pray for those who are ready to repent and believe. It is the best news ever. So if that is you and you're ready to give your life to Christ, repent and believe, repent and return, I'm gonna ask you to respond; it will not be the hardest thing you do for your faith. And would you come off your knees and stand, if that is you who want to repent and believe.

Thank you. I see you. I'm proud of you. Wherever you're at, would you stand if it's time to repent and believe, thank you, I see you. I'm so proud of you. If you're standing with me, Christian, Zeke and I are so proud of you. And more than anything, Jesus is ready to receive you, so if you're standing, would you repeat after me. If you're not standing, you're praying for those who are standing, OK? So if you're standing, repeat after me: Jesus, You are Lord and Savior; because of your holiness, I confess my sins. We're gonna take a second for you to confess your sins. (Pause. Applause.)

When you're ready, why don't you pray after me, say I receive your grace and forgiveness. Holy Spirit, will You fill those empty places? I give You leadership over my life. I'm about to say amen and then in the last two weeks, it's kind of tradition as a family that we celebrate. But before we do that, I want to tell you those who are standing up, those who are online, those are in extensions, if you're in a physical location, will you come forward so we can get you connected? If you're online, we have ways for you to connect. Do not miss this opportunity to not only repent and believe but be formed and become more like Jesus. So, those are standing up, would you declare your salvation? That this is your response by saying amen; ready? Amen. Amen.

(applause, standing ovation)

(Another song; Ruben Cervantes sings I Surrender All)

Thai Lam (while song continues)

Thank you for joining us tonight, we're so thankful (inaudible) taking next steps of your faith. If tonight you responded with an invitation to receive Jesus, Or if tonight you are rededicating your life to the Lord, we want to pray for you. If you would take a moment and use the QR code. (The screen has a QR code with the word "respond" next to it.)

And use this QR code, we want you to be able to have someone pray for you. We want to be able to connect you with a local church. So if you'd just take a moment and click on this link, fill out this form, we would love to be able to have someone reach out to you and follow up with you and help connect you to a community of faith.. (begins to pray, as the song is continuing to go)

Jeannie Banter, Major Giving Officer at Asbury University and director of The Christian Life Project at Asbury, also on the World Gospel Mission (WGM) Board of Directors along with school President Kevin Brown (piano continues) https://www.asbury.edu/about/directory/jeannie-banter/

The beautiful thing's about when God pours Himself out, is that He not only pours out His love, but He pours out His healing. And He pours out His healing because He loves us, There's been no shortage of healing on our campus, and the people who've come here. And as the people have gone out, we've just seen so much healing happen. We've seen spiritual healing, we've seen people healed from church hurt. We've seen emotional healing, mental health — gone, anxiety, gone; depression, gone. (Applause.)

We've seen relational healing on our campus, people who were not friends before worshipping together. When His healing comes, nothing is left undone. We wanna give testimony to the healing that we've seen and borne witness to. And who better to hear it from then some of our students.

This first student here was here from the very beginning. She was part of the gospel choir. So she's had a front row seat to everything that God has been doing.

Lena Marlowe (musicians behind sit down, piano continues):

Hi my name is Lena Marlowe. I am a senior here at Asbury, I'm studying sociology. And I just want to talk a little bit about what I've see God doing amongst our students as a student leader. And so, the first hour like Jeannie said, I was a part of the gospel choir, and we were just feeling led by the Spirit to just continue in song and worship and prayer. It kinda felt like 10 minutes, but then three hours later, I just felt the Spirit tell me to just look around, and the same 20 students stayed, and probably skipped their 11 a.m., including me.

And I just decided to just ask the Holy Spirit like what was happening and what I needed to be interceding for. So I just heard Him say that first, just pray for your peers to be obedient to stay and come, and just spread the word. So I prayed for that, and the second wave was just to ask for forgiveness for the things that we've done against each other. And also just grudges we had against each other and towards the institution. And then the third one, the third wave was just joy and confession, and from confession comes joy, so I think maybe like the fourth hour, when students started to come in in waves, I just saw a bunch of people jumping and praising God and just crying, just because of like the joy and the freedom that the Spirit was just pouring down on us. And then the last wave was just like seeking the Lord and asking for more.

And probably the second day was fully students, students from here but also from seminary and surrounding campuses, and I just saw a lot of reconciliation. And so I just pray as you're here and you're experiencing the move of God that won't end, the same God that's here is moving in a lot of other places across the world and in other denominations and other homes. So I just

pray that your obedience being here and your obedience to listen to the Spirit doesn't just stop tonight. It continues throughtout your whole walk with Christ.

But I just pray as you continue to plant seeds in other's lives, and also as the Spirit plants seeds, that you continue to water that and read your word, and praying and intercession and going to your friends and asking questions; it's nothing wrong with asking questions and ask professors questions. Don't keep that towards yourself, it's how the body of Christ grows. Use your gifts. So yeah, I just pray for everyone here. I love you, but Jesus loves you more.

Older Guy in a vest (later identified as New Room / Seedbed's David Thomas); name isn't apparent, but in later comments, it appears that he might be connected either with the town or one of the Asbury universities or the nearby church (piano continues)

We're going to return to prayer here in just a minute, and we're gonna pray along these lines that we've been watching God revealed to us that we believe God is coming to rescue this generation. It will no longer be known as a generation of anxiety, depression, and death; it'll be known as the generation of joy, fulfillment, and life. And I just wonder if we could just hear more about how it is that we've been watching and experiencing God's love begin to move and heal and change us on the inside.

Female student (piano continues):

Yeah, so for over half my life, my identity has resided in my depression and my anxiety. And on Wednesday, February 8, God showed up to Asbury, and He convicted me to give up some anger and resentment that I had towards Him, towards other people in my life just for things that have been affected by my anxiety and my depression. And even bigger, He asked that I lay control at the feet of the cross. And I have done this many times in prayer, but I always kinda swiped it up as I walked away. And so for the first time in my life, I actually left all of that at the feet of Jesus. (Applause.)

Yeah, and I left Hughes, and I could breathe easier and the air in my lungs was so much lighter, and in Matthew 11:28-30, God says come to Me all you who are weary and I will give you rest; take My yoke upon you and learn from Me, for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls, for My yoke is easy and my burden is light. And for four straight days, I experienced no anxiety. (Applause) It eventually came back, but my freedom didn't come in the form of depression and anxiety evacuating my life completely, but it came in the form of the control they had over my life being gone completely. (Applause.)

And my identity comes first from Christ and my daughtership in him, and I really wish that my story was unique, but anxiety and depression have become the calling cards of the younger generations. And I have seen God move in miraculous ways in college students over the past couple weeks. And my two biggest things in revival that God has revealed to me is one; my God is bigger than I thought he was. Because my God is bigger than my depression and my God is bigger than my anxiety, and my story could be your story because God died on the cross for anxiety and depression to set us free, He walked out of the grave and you can too because I did. (Applause.) My final revelation was remembering not who I am but whose I am.

Jeannie Banter (piano continues)

One of the beautiful things that we've been able to bear witness to is how we watch countenances change. These students are not the same when we saw them two weeks ago; they're different, their face is different, their body's different, and I just want to hear one more testimony of how he's changed.

Guy wearing a shirt saying High Peak that has the Salvation Army emblem on it (piano continues)

So I was raised as a pastor's kid; a lot of you guys probably already know my story. As I grew up, I began to slowly choose the world more and more. I started to feed my flesh more than feed my soul. Eventually as I got to the summer before my senior year, I hit a season of my life that has brought a lot of trauma to my life and sent me into a season of dark depression. And characteristic of everything else our generation's gone though, and for that whole senior year, I struggled heavily with mental illness and suicidal ideations. I just longed to belong, to be loved, and I've been running away from God, for so long, I didn't know where to start. I began to go back to what I've been doing for years and run to things that only provided momentary pleasure and left me emptier than I was before.

In the last two or three weeks, I felt the love of God in a way that I never had before. In the chaos of my life and trauma, I felt Him embrace me. I felt so desired and sought after by the Father, and truly can say that I belong in this amazing body of believers. God's mighty hand has been at work in obvious ways here on this campus. I've see people's health restored physically, chains been broken and ultimately lives saved as people have given their lives to Jesus. It has been the wildest two weeks in my life, but I couldn't be more grateful. (Applause.)

Guy in vest who spoke previously (David Thomas) (piano continues)

So, we want to return to prayer because yes, these last couple of weeks have been extraordinary, but in reality, they're normal — this is normal Christianity, this is what Jesus died to make possible, this is what we want to happen and God wants to happen on every campus, in every heart and home, and church, and city. And so we want to just stand in a moment p, join hands with two or three near you; wherever you are, just join up in a little huddle, and let's contend for our campus, for an outbreak of healing, for a great move of God to pour out His love and set us free. This is what we need in this generation. We have signs, we have evidence that God is wanting to do it. So let's ask Him for it. Are you ready? So let's stand up, let's cry out to God for healing in this generation.

(Piano plays, people gather in groups, the word "RESPOND" and QR code with the collegiate day of prayer logo come back up)

(Young lady — now evidently identified as IHOP-affiliated singer-songwriter Amariah Mello Alonge — who had been standing behind just about every speaker and rocking back-and-forth for the previous hour and a half was singing some song for which the

lyrics did not appear in a web search. [One recent YouTube video of it indicates in the comment section that it was her song.] Ruben Cervantes sings along in the chorus, and there was apparently a video on an IHOP related YouTube site showing the two of them singing the same song together in March 2023. In the middle, someone said 'everyone sing.' Towards the end of the song, it sounded like she was shouting out words — 'Consume us holy' repeated, as well as 'mark the generation' and 'secret place of thunder' — and while doing so, was joined by a gray haired gentleman on stage who was shouting as well: "Not one missing! Mark them!")

Gray haired man, eventually identified as IHOP's Allen Hood, one of the three along with Warren and Chan listed as scheduled to make an appearance (with what seems to go from shouting to screaming at times — and as they seemed like they may have brought down the singer's microphone; piano continues):

Love them! [Applause]

[Music] [Applause] Mark them!

[Music] [Applause] [Music]

[Applause] [Music] Not one missing! Mark them! Mark them!

[Applause] Good today. Good tonight.

[Music] Everything Jesus died for! everything He purchased, Father, (inaudible) everything He's prayed for at Your right hand. Give it to him: every campus, every nation, every government. Give it to Him; give it to Him. [Applause]

(Appears to read Revelation 11:15) then the seventh angel sounded and there were loud voices in heaven saying the kingdoms of this world have become the kingdoms of God and his Christ and He shall reign forever and ever

And tonight, we come declaring to the world what the apostles and Prophets always declared, that darkness shall come to an end. [Applause] [Music]

And that the last trumpet shall sound, the Archangel shall shout and the Lord Himself will shout, and He will split the sky. It will roll back like a scroll, and we will see the greatest transference of power the world has ever witnessed, with the Father who has promised His Son the nation, will give it to Him as His inheritance.

Beloved, right now, Jesus is ruling and reigning as the King of Kings and Lord of Lords at the right hand of the Father. The angels know this. The saints know this. But today, the kingdoms of this world, the governments of this world do not know that He is the King of Kings and Lord of Lords. And yet, the Father has promised and Zephaniah 2:11 says that in that day, He will show himself awesome to them, and He will reduce the gods of the earth to nothing, so that the peoples can worship Him from every shore.

Church History also tells us there are divine seasons when God puts the world on notice that what the angels know around the throne of God — that Jesus Christ is Lord of all, He puts geographic regions on notice that He is the Lord of all. That in a moment, His Spirit is poured out and what's true around Heaven becomes clear on the earth to sinner and believer alike. Tonight, we want to begin to pray that what you've experienced, all the nations of the world would experience, that what heaven knows about Jesus, all the nations would know about Jesus. Beloved, we are crying out for revival on every college campus tonight, to have a revival — but beloved, I want to put something bigger than just college campuses before all of you.

The Apostle Peter promised that God would pour out His Spirit on all flesh, and His sons and daughters would prophesy and that before that coming great day of the Lord, there would be a great crying out for salvation in the nation, and that even Israel would call out blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord; amen [Music]

What began in that upper room with the local outpouring of the Holy Spirit has now had Global impact as the nations of the Earth are coming to the saving knowledge of the Lord Jesus. Well beloved, we want to believe that in the last days, God would pour out His Spirit on all flesh, a global outpouring of the Spirit, way bigger than Asbury way bigger than Wilmore, way bigger than Methodism. That God would pour out His Spirit on all flesh, and that it would lead to a mighty Revival. A great a great influence of the Harvest of souls that are even a billion people could turn to Jesus and that the church would walk in fullness, the church, fullness of the wisdom, the fruit, and the power of the Holy Spirit. That even Israel might be provoked to jealousy and cry out that Jesus is Lord of all.

[Applause]

So right now, we want to huddle again and pray that Jesus would receive the reward of His suffering in every nation of the Earth. That there would be a mighty revival in the church that would lead to maturity, and great awakening in every society of the Earth. Let's begin to lift our voices.

Pause. The main acoustic guitar singer guy — Ruben Cervantes returns:

Yeah, just get in your groups and let's just cry out that God would do this. Just get into groups for a few minutes, just believe it. And ask God that He would have His inheritance right now.

(Woman seems to be singing an improvised song along lines of what was said. Then, a song played called Every Nation Every Soul by Lindy Cofer and Circuit Rider music, who appears to be connected with YWAM)

AJ, male student from Indiana Wesleyan with earring (Gestures, people sit)

If you're in the middle of a moment with the Lord right now, I beg you that you not listen to a word I say but keep doing that. my name is AJ, I'm a student at Indiana Wesleyan University, and I'm horribly unworthy to be on this stage in front of you guys, but the God that I get to tell of is so much more worthy. and so I hope that in my words, you hear nothing but praise and glory to Him.

In May at the beginning of this year, I got invited to a conference in Lexington, Kentucky with some other student leaders across the country, and one of the things that we did is we came to this room and we got on our knees and we prayed the Lord would do this right here. And I sat back in that corner, and I laid on my face, and I was begging the Lord to do something, and I wish I could

tell you it was this hopeful, expectant prayer. But, quite honestly, it was the worst couple hours of my life because I was so consumed with the costs. I was so upset at everything He was asking me to say no to.

Everything He was asking — I cried at the loss of everything that I felt like He was taking from me. And, in this moment right now, I just want you to know that when you step into the fullness of an answered prayer, the cost is so light. And so, as we leave this place in a little bit, and you feel the costs of what the Lord is asking you to say 'no' to, I urge you brothers and sisters to not see it as a 'no,' but see it as a 'yes' that He is asking you to step into. There is a world out there that has no clue of the goodness that you and I have felt in this place. And so, I beg you right now, teachers, make your classrooms sanctuaries, dads and moms, would you make your households temples? Pastors, would you begin to make your churches nothing but holy ground?

When we step into our communities and would we not let it be good enough in our hearts that we've experienced this goodness, and our baristas and our cashiers and our waitresses and our neighbors and our friends and our families have not yet. It is so selfish for us to ask for the Lord to come back, to beg him to come back, and to not tell people, so let us be a people, be a generation that gets on our knees and prays and believes in the power of prayer. That believes that when we pray for things in accordance to His will, He will answer them, and He will fulfill them because He is a zealous God who is chasing our hearts. And the same way that He's chasing us right now, He wants to chase this generation, and He wants to use us as vessels.

(As TBN stopped putting up the names of the people who are obviously not students after Thai Lam and the school president, some searching was involved to find some of the participants. The last one appears to be Bill Elliff, National Engage pastor at the Summit Church Little Rock. He claims to have "been a student of God's revival moments across history for 50 years,", who traveled for several years to churches helping them pursue God in revival. He is also "a founding member of the OneCry initiative that seeks to help pastors and churches pursue God for revival and spiritual awakening." That initiative is one of the contributors to the Collegiate Day of Prayer Movement, which seems to focus on revival and awakening in many of the related articles.)

(No piano; pace of speech seemed remarkably slower than just about any other speaker)

Bill Ellif

So what do we do now? Right? So 16 days ago, the Lord decided on the heels of prayers and surrender to call some of you to just tarry, just wait — we never do that — and thank God for the 20 who stayed and just waited. And then 200 and then 2000, and then tonight, thousands upon thousands, and we're praying for millions, amen? (Applause.) And you say well, what did God do, what happened in that moment — I love Psalm 48:3, the Lord has chosen to make Himself known. He's showing the world, He's showing you, He's showing all of us who He really is.

Jonathan Edwards said our task as a church is to give the world a right opinion of God, right? And so, God has chosen to make Himself known, and that's why you have been overwhelmed by the loving kindness of God, right? Because that's who God is, and we've been overwhelmed with the righteousness and the holiness of God. And in His light, we've seen light, and we've seen our own sin and our own need, and we've fallen down before Him, and we repented and we surrendered because He's so loving, so kind, so gracious, we gladly bow before him.

And that's why, isn't it, we all just started singing? I mean just singing to the Lord; it's like the blind man who was healed by Jesus, and the first thing he saw when he opened his eyes was the eyes of Jesus Christ. And you just have to think he's thought I will never go anyplace else; this is the One who gives us life and that's why you've been worshiping the Lord for the past 360+ hours. (Applause.)

I wanna ask you a question: has anybody in your your generation ever done that? What — would could you do that, would you have done that on your own, if we said we have a new plan by the way, a little program, we want you to worship God with no intermission for 16 days, would you have done that — you know who's done this? God has done this; just give Him glory, amen? (Applause.)

He's given us a gift. (Appears to choke up) It's a really precious gift. It's a gift of His manifest presence. And we've seen it and we've I want to tell you something from an old guy who in 1970 in a college in Arkansas the same size as Asbury, one day right after the Asbury revival, the Lord touched down on our campus. And all classes were canceled and the same things were happening that you've experienced these last days, and I was in that room and I have to tell you something that's about to happen, are you ready? Youwill never ever ever be the same. (Applause.) You'll never think the same, you will never be satisfied again (appears to choke up) with anything less than Jesus. (Applause; piano starts.)

You'll I never again be able to live a merely selfish life because you encountered Christ. And that's what happened to me. I was given that gift in my generation — many of us were given that gift in 1970, and I have pursued the presence of God ever since. I want His presence in my home. I want His presence in my church. I want to spread it because if there's anything we know, is that everything flows from the presence of the Lord. Everything. If you have Him, you have everything you need, right? If you don't have Him, you have nothing that matters, and nothing that lasts. Life is just formal, life it's just religious, and life is really empty.

And so, God has given you a gift, and that's why one of the remarkable things to me but not, not you — you can understand it, is that there's been these moments of incredible praise, right, where you guys are about to bring the rafters down, but then there's been moments for 16 days of quietness, and it takes your breath away. The Bible has a word for that: it's awe. It's amazement. You just can't believe how beautiful God is. How sufficient He is, how he's everything your heart has long for, and you need.

In 2nd Kings, we're going to pray — in 2nd Kings 7, it tells a story when the nation of Israel, city of Israel, was surrounded by enemies, they're completely overpowering and they cut off their food source, and they were dying, they're starving to death. And Elijah the prophet said tomorrow at this time, everybody will have enough food. And a skeptic — there's always skeptics, right? A skeptic said, behold, is the Lord should make windows in heaven, could this thing be, and Elijah looked at him and said, behold, you will see it with your own eyes but you're not gonna taste it. That's what happens to skeptics.

And there were four lepers, and they're all lepers, right? And they were sitting at the gate, and they looked at each other and they said why should we stay here till we die? If we go in the city, we're gonna die. If we stay here at the gate, we're going to die, so let's go to the enemy; maybe we will get a good meal before we die. And they went out and they found that God had routed the enemy. Everything is left, they sit down and ate an unbelievable meal, and then finally they stopped and said you know what, we're not doing the right thing. This is a day of good news, we're keeping silent, let's get up and go to our city. A brother wants call that the story of the sitters, and the getters, and then the goers and the tellers, right?

So this moment, this final moment of prayer, we're gonna ask you to do something just very quietly, but ask that you all stand right now just very quietly. All of you who are watching, would you stand, maybe by yourself, you stand, you may be in your church or on your college campus. I wonder if just very quietly, you would turn to one other person close to you and lay your hands on each other's shoulders. Would you do that?

Now, listen if you would; realize it is not merely your friend's hands on your shoulders. The Lord's hand is on you. And even in this moment, He wants to manifest Himself even more, and He wants to commission you. He wants to call you not to be just a sitter or a kind of a selfish just go get and eat and enjoy it. He's telling us right now to turn our eyes off Asbury and turn your eyes to your city, to your campus, to you're lost friends, to your family, and to every tongue, people, tribe, and nation. And God is changing you and making you aware of His completely sufficient presence, because He's calling you to go.

(Church planting, mobilizing labor and finance through radical humility, etc.?)

In this next moment, we're gonna pray for each other and we're going to commission each other. Now if you're a pastor that's watching or a housewife or something, would you pray that you will cooperate with God just as much as these students? That you'll tarry? That you'll wait until the Lord comes with healing in His wings? And would you, would you commit right now as we pray together that you will not be like some who would quench the Holy Spirit and resist the moving in the next generation — because that's where it's coming from, and it's gonna require us to change some wineskins, to let go of some things.

(Comment: And there it is. What exactly needs to be let go of, and who's going to be driving that train?)

But would you pray that God would fall upon you and Commission you and you obey, and for all of you students, as we pray for each other, would you commission your brother, your sister by God to be the light in this generation?

(Comment: Commissioning "by God" – – on which he seem to place a particular emphasis? What about cautions about laying hands on hastily? How doesn't that apply? This went from people being called to say amen as a profession of faith, to having the same people in the auditorium engage in a commissioning before they might've had a discussion of all of this with anyone?)

And I want to ask you not to pray just a nice prayer; don't pray a prayer that you manufacture to impress each other. Ask the Spirit of God right now to pray through you, right, to commission them. So with all of your heart, let's pray God's hand, God's commission on all of us right now. let's pray.

(Long pause with piano playing, more shots of students. One of the songs after this is Be Enthroned, attributed to Bethel Music and Jeremy Riddle)

Vest man (David Thomas) returns:

Well, as this collegiate day of prayer now draws to a close, we, we want to thank all of you for coming here, and wherever you've been around the world tonight. And we are super grateful to everyone who has just made their way over these last two weeks as we have just try to form community under an outpouring and hold it and let Jesus do all that He would do in those days. It's been like a vessel that we've tried to form, just being family together, but tonight we wanted to empty that vessel. And all that He's poured out, we've wanted to send it away into all the different places that we have been. So as we go, this continues, and it continues in our relationship.

I would just invite you to find friends whose hearts are burning and bind together in a call to prayer, and hold one another, to build trust and do whatever it takes to keep it, and in that, come into agreement and trust God for more. And then let's just take up that most ancient prayer of the church: come, Holy Spirit, come. That is one prayer we are confident God is sure to answer. Let's continue to pray it. And let's do so lastly with a heart like His, a heart like Jesus that when He saw Jerusalem, He wept over it. Let's invite Him to give us tears for our campuses, tears for our cities, for our families, for those we love. And we will watch Him do this and so much more in all the days to come; so thank you again for being a part of this tonight. We pray God will go with you and bless you.

(Applause)

Thai Lam

We just want to say thank you to Asbury University, for Asbury Theological Seminary, for the city of Wilmore, for all the staff, administration, volunteers. It's been in the army to sustain what God's done here, and as we're finishing tonight, it really isn't the end, it really is the beginning. This historic day of prayer came forth out of a movement called the concert of prayer. And on this 200 year anniversary, as I'm just considering just the kindness and the faithfulness of God to resurrect this historic day in a new generation, we want to launch — or really, relaunch — a monthly concert of prayer. That the last Thursday of every month. we want to cry out with one voice, and call upon the name of our God. That this is really not a destination, but this is really launching us into a movement of fervent prayer for breakthrough.

We want to knock on the door of heaven until God answers, because I tell you that what we're seeing, what we've seen here, there's been a hundred thousand people who have come to Wilmore to encounter Jesus. But I tell you, there's 100 million in the days to come that the Lord wants to encounter as He's done here. Would you join us in this movement of fervent prayer for revival and spiritual awakening in Gen Z? 20,000,000 college students, on 430 campuses. Tonight if you haven't already done so,

adopt a campus. I know, this is fun. Our web server crashed. There's so many people that went, that our server crashed. Praise God. (Applause.)

I want to charge you for the campuses that you've adopted, let this not be the only day and the only night that you're praying for them. What would it be if you took the campus that you adopted that's down the street from your home, from your church, and what if you set your heart for the next year — just once a week — just set your heart, set an alarm, say Father, move on my campus. Do it again as you did at Asbury. Pour out Your Spirit on my campus. And what if there were hundreds of thousands that were praying across America once a day, once a week, once a month. We have some resources for you on the website, go to <u>Collegiatedayofprayer.org</u>, you can click on the QR code. We have some resources and tools.

We just launched a YouVersion: 40 Day prayer guide, 30 day prayer guide.

We would invite you to consider joining our prayer guide for the next month. Every day, just take five minutes and pray for your campus, and then we come back next month on the last Thursday. We don't know how, but just virtually, we will just have a call to prayer. And wherever you're at, that we would join together, link arms virtually across America, across the globe, and we say Father, as You've done before, do it again. So we don't know when and what the Lord has in store in the days ahead, but I tell you, the best days and the greater things are ahead. And Asbury is but a launching pad for us. So as we close tonight, and as we launch into our worship party after this, can I ask you guys just to raise your hand where you're at? Can we raise our hands just in surrender?

So Father, we say here we are, here we are; thank You for all that You've done here in Wilmore, at Asbury, God. Father, we say blessed be the name of our God, we say thank You for Your goodness and form Your power, for salvation, for healing for deliverance, for restoration, for renewal, God; and we're asking God that what You've started here wouldonly multiply, God; we're asking God for the fire that's burning here, that You would cause the sparks of revival to go forth; we're asking God for the winds of heaven to blow, and that You would cause the sparks here to go far and wide, God. Touch the corners of our nation, God. Kentucky to Washington, to California to Maine, to Florida, and we're asking, God the end of the earth; cause, God, the testimony of Your Son, Your power, to go forth from here. And we're asking God, anoint us. Everyone put your hand on your chest. Father, will You anoint us with **radical humility**?

(Comment: What followed seemed noteworthy. Starting with the above sentence, much of the crowd — many of whom were already extending their hands towards the stage — repeat every word after him until the end of the prayer. Lam appears to adjust his cadence accordingly. Aside: did that coincide with the invocation of the words "radical humility"?)

Father, teach us how to go low as Your Son went low. Give us eyes to see the beauty of Your Son's humility; make us like Jesus. That we would walk how He walked and talk how He talked, that we would have the aroma of Jesus to a lost and dying world; anoint us with Your Son's humility; in Jesus' name; amen.

(Loud eruption from crowd that sustains, as Lam calls on the crowd to "lift our voices", makes repeated hand gestures upwards, then appears to be chanting "Jesus, Jesus, Jesus", which much of the crowd emulates and claps along to; the simulcast closes on end chorus repeated of All Sons and Daughters song Great are You Lord, then You Deserve it All by Josh Baldwin from Bethel Music, then back into the chorus of Great are You Lord, then Jesus We Love You by Bethel Music, then acoustic guitar guy — Ruben Cervantes— improvs for a while, then to God of Revival by Bethel Music led by the woman who appeared to have performed with BVM previously. The video eventually fades out.)
