WELL-BEING DAYS FOR OLDER ADULTS -MIGUEL HERNÁNDEZ UNIVERSITY

Demographic ageing is a significant challenge in the 21st century, especially in Spain, where life expectancy is increasing and the birth rate is declining. By 2050, over 35% of the population is expected to be over 65, highlighting the need for actions to improve the well-being and quality of life of older adults.

Occupational therapy plays a vital role in addressing these challenges, using daily life occupations to promote health, well-being, and independent living for older adults. The Degree in Occupational Therapy at Miguel Hernández University (San Juan de Alicante, Spain) has proactively responded to this issue by organizing the "Wellbeing Days for Older Adults" in collaboration with the Mutxamel City Council. The event creates a platform for students and older adults to exchange experiences and knowledge.

The first edition of the event took place on March 17, 2023, with workshops on self-care and health, engaging 120 older adults and 16 students. Building on its success, the second edition was held on April 19, 2024, incorporating a participatory process to gather feedback from students and older adults to ensure the content met community needs.



The events received overwhelmingly positive feedback, with all participants in the latest edition expressing enjoyment and interest in future activities. This demonstrates the effectiveness of these initiatives in promoting older adults' well-being and social participation.

For students, these events provide valuable practical experience, enabling them to apply classroom knowledge, develop transversal skills, and strengthen their social commitment.

The "Wellbeing Days" illustrate how collaboration between academic institutions and local communities can foster a healthier, more active society. Miguel Hernández University's Occupational Therapy program reaffirms its commitment to improving the well-being of older adults and promoting active ageing, ensuring a dignified and fulfilling life for all.

GREENTOUCH: XR IN OCCUPATIONAL THERAPY FOR THE ECOLOGICAL HANDPRINT

The Institute for Advanced Studies (IHS), Austrian Institute of Technology (AIT), University of Applied Sciences St. Pölten, future minds, in-scope and the IMC University of Applied Sciences Krems are researching the use of Extended Reality (XR) in occupational therapy to promote climate-friendly action in the FFG project 'GreenTouch'.

The World Health Organisation describes the climate change as the biggest threat to global health and calls for changes at a societal, social and individual level (WHO 2021). This is where the FFG GreenTouch project comes in and offers innovative solutions for the field of occupational therapy: therapists should use Extended Reality (XR) to develop the necessary climate skills themselves and then pass them on to their clients with the help of technology. Occupational therapists act as multipliers of climate-neutral action and therefore promote the ecological handprint.

Occupational therapists support their clients in improving their ability to act in everyday life. In doing so, they can make a decisive contribution to individual occupational adaptations and increasing resilience in dealing with environmental changes. Clients who are restricted in their participation are actively involved in climate protection, which strengthens social participation and promotes health. To do this successfully, they need specific skills, which are taught in the GreenTouch project with the help of low-threshold extended reality (XR). The focus is on the co-creative process of developing an XR research prototype involving experts, practitioners and clients. The potential of XR technologies to increase climate literacy will be analysed through comprehensive evaluation in terms of applicability, user experience, usability and interaction possibilities. This prototype is intended to facilitate the learning and understanding of complex content through visual, acoustic and haptic elements and thus enable sustainable adaptation to action.

The results of the project should help to support the United Nations' Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) 3, 4, 12 and 13 in the areas of health, education and climate protection. Practical solutions will be developed and summarised in a didactic concept and a final letter of policy.

The team has expertise and experience in the areas of VR/XR, co-creation, training, climate communication and occupational therapy. IMC Krems is largely involved in the co-creative process and contributes its occupational therapy expertise to the project.

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

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
