Phonics	We will upload a daily phonics sound, video link and activity to Dojo. As we are in the revision stages it may seem that we are covering the same sounds repeatedly; this is intentional.
Reading	Letter match Write or print out 2 sets of letters (use orange sound book as a guide so digraphs and trigraphs are included too) Hide one set around the house and keep the others in a pile. Turn over a letter, say the sound and then hunt for it. Try making words with the sounds you have found You will soon be sent a log in and password for Rising Stars. This website has access to a range of books for you to read. Have fun!
Writing	Login to Purple Mash (or complete on paper) Draw Supertato and label him with describing words. Think about what he looks like and describe his skills too.
Maths	Practise counting to 10 in 2s and 100 in 10s (use objects to support-could be 'super' potatoes!) Use mirrors to explore doubles of objects. Place a few items in front of the mirror, how many are there altogether? Write this into a part-whole model - see example below (Your child has learnt how to use a Part/Part/Whole model).
Art and Creative	Create a pattern-Cut a strip of paper and start a pattern of drawings. These could be shapes, colours, numbers, sticker. Have your child finish the patterns. Swap turns.
Understanding the world	Find out how potatoes grow... Where do they come from? What do they need to survive? Use Purple Mash or a piece of paper to create a poster of the things a plant needs to live. Physical Development	Try out some Yoga. Mojo has some yoga tips on his Big Ideas page (Class Dojo), or you could join Jaime on Cosmic Kids on YouTube.
PSED	Take a poll-Send a message to your family and friends asking them for example what their favourite animal/colour/food is. Record this in anyway your child wishes.
Mental health and life skills	Use your whole body to tidy and clean a room-maybe your bedroom? Reach high and low as you dust, Hoover, sweep, look for cobwebs...How do you feel now that you have finished? Do you feel you have done a good job? Maybe you might like to do it again!
