Please ask mum or dad to check Purple Mash to see your To Do's. Please also do lots of other things, particularly things that you really enjoy. This term we are using **Supertato** as a stimulus. Please revisit the story upload this week to support the learning.

Parents- Remember there is no pressure to complete everything. These are ideas to help provide some educational support and potential routine during this time. Please regularly upload to Dojo and/or Tapestry anything you get up to, we look forward to seeing it all.

Phonics	We will upload a daily phonics sound, video link and activity to Dojo. As we are in the revision stages it may seem that we are covering the same sounds repeatedly; this is intentional.
Reading	Create a story map for the story of Supertato. See attached for an example and use Mrs Chrimes video to the story to make it your own. Use the story map to rehearse telling the story over and over. This helps us to learn the story language and structure ready for telling and writing our own stories. Log in to rising stars and read at least 1 book and have a go at the quiz too.
Writing	Login to Purple Mash (or this activity could be completed on paper)- Create a wanted poster for Evil Pea. Don't forget to describe him so we know who we are looking out for. What 3d shape is he? Colour? Have a go at writing in sentences using your sound cards or orange books to help. Parents remember that we will be looking for the sounds the children know rather than correct spellings. E.g. pee for pea is perfect!
Maths	Practise counting to 10 in 2s and count to 100 in 10s (you could use objects to support and show the counting visually-you could use 'super' potatoes!) Complete the ladybird doubles activity. We have also put in some colour by numbers addition sheets - your child should be able to complete these independently with some objects to count. These will be uploaded as files.
Art and Creative	Potato printing. Use a range of paints. Cut potatoes in half with your grown up. You may even want to include some patterns on each half of potato. What other fruits and veg could you print with? Are the effects and outcomes different?
Understanding the world	If you have any seeds around the house perhaps you could plant them. Or maybe you have some seeds from your fruit you have been eating. You could plant vegetable seeds, herbs, or plants. Observe them daily and keep a record of growth.
Physical Development	Pretend you are a superhero like Supertato. Make your own circuit at home. Think about skills you could work on such as jumping, balancing and hopping.
PSED	What is your super power? We are all unique and wonderful in our own special ways. What makes you special and would your superpower be? Some suggestions are being kind, being helpful and sharing. Make a poster or superhero banner to promote your superpower.
Mental health and life skills	Help a grown up at home prepare lunch or dinner. Try a new fruit or vegetable and review it with your family. What is your favourite fruit or veg? Ask the people in your family, give your furthest away relative a call and ask them too. There is a pictogram on Purple Mash to fill in.
