Phonics

This week we are going to focus on the 'ee' family pattern and look at some tricky words. These activities follow a similar pattern based on the week before Easter. Use the practical elements or create your own to make the word bank then create a sentence challenge to practise reading and writing. Repeat the below 'ee' examples with the tricky word- 'do'

Can you make some words out of lego or construction with tricky word 'said' or the 'ee' sound in them such as sheep?

Speed write- Go outside with a paint brush and water or chalk and set a timer- how many times can you write 'do' or 'ee' words can you write in 1 minute?

Choose a favourite book and be a digraph spotter! How many 'ee' words did you find? How many times did you find 'do'.

Now with the 'ee' words you have made, wrote and read think of a silly sentence to put them in. For example "In the week, Lee feeds his sheep leeks". Can you extend these sentences but using conjunctions such as 'and' or 'because'. For example "In the week, Lee feeds his sheep leeks because they are green, do you?" Don't forget capital letters and full stops and include the tricky word if possible!
