Phonics	We will upload a daily phonics sound, video link and activity to Dojo. As we are in the revision stages it may seem that we are covering the same sounds repeatedly; this is intentional.
Reading	Listen to a story this week and see how much of it you can retell. You could choose Supertato, or another story you enjoy. Can you pretend to be the different characters? See if your family will join in too. What do you need to say? What actions should you do? Log in to Rising Stars and read at least 1 book and have a go at the quiz too.
Writing	Login to Purple Mash (or this activity could be completed on paper)- Evil Pea has captured our friend Carrot! What might Carrot be saying? Who could he be talking to, Supertato or Evil Pea?
Maths	-Practise counting to 10 in 2s and count to 100 in 10s (you could use objects to support and show the counting visually-you could use 'super' potatoes!) -Complete the doubles worksheet working again on the doubles within 10 and then when you feel confident have a go a doubles to 20. Can you remember what + and = mean? -Play 4 in a row, addition! If you don't have 2 dice, create 2 sets of flash cards with the numbers 1-6. Use objects to help with the addition.
Art and Creative	Create a trap to capture the Evil Pea before he causes any more trouble! It would be great if you could design this on paper first so you have a plan to follow. Use the things you have at home to construct your trap. If you change your trap, edit your plan too to show the changes and explain to your grown u your reasons behind your plan.
Understanding the world	Think you know your fruits from your veggies? Have a go at sorting these foods. Or you could make 2 lists sorting the food from your fridge.
Physical Development	Imagine you are Supertato and create a tunnel or crawl space. How small can you get? Can you use your arms to pull yourself through? Try a commando crawl. Use the muscles in your tummy (core) to help you move along.
PSED	Invent a turn taking game involving fruits and veg. It could be a card game, a board game or an action game but it <b>must</b> have <b>turn taking and fruit and veg</b> in it. Have fun with this one. Some ideas to magpie might be snap, fruit machine or a reading game!
Mental health and life skills	Sort out and wash some of your favourite toys. Hopefully there will be some sunshine so they can dry in the garden. Can you remember where these toys came from? Were they presents or did you choose them? Who gave it to you? What material is it made of? If you had to choose only one, which would it be? Do you have any toys you no longer play with that you could box up for a charity shop?
