Phonics 'ue' and 'people'

This week we are going to focus on the 'ue' family pattern and look at some tricky words. There are 3 main, different ways to spell this sound. Use the practical elements or create your own to make the word bank then create a sentence challenge to practise reading and writing. Repeat the below 'ue' examples with the tricky word- 'people'

Can you make some words out of lego or construction with tricky word 'people' or the 'ue' sound in them such as blue?

Speed write- Go outside with a paint brush and water or chalk and set a timer- how many times can you write 'people' or 'ue' words can you write in 1 minute?

Choose a favourite book and be a digraph spotter! How many 'ue' words did you find? How many times did you find 'people'.

Now with the 'ue' words you have made, wrote and read think of a silly sentence to put them in. For example "Sue has a box of blue tissues." Can you extend these sentences but using conjunctions such as 'and' or 'because'. For example "Sue has a box of blue tissues and helps people who have the flu." Don't forget capital letters and full stops and include the tricky word if possible!

Fluency - Find the missing numbers

Remember to use objects to help you, or use a part part whole model.

$2 + \square = 7$

$6 + \square = 8$

$1 + \square = 8$

$5 + \square = 6$

$\square + 4 = 6$

$\square + 3 = 6$

$\square + 2 = 6$

$\square = 3 + 4$

$3 + \square = 8$

$0 + \square = 7$

$8 = \square + 1$

$5 + \square = 8$
