Phonics 'er' and 'looked'

This week we are going to focus on the 'er' family pattern and look at some tricky words. There are 3 main, different ways to spell this sound. Use the practical elements or create your own to make the word bank then create a sentence challenge to practise reading and writing. Repeat the below 'er' examples with the tricky word- 'looked'

Can you make some words out of lego or construction with tricky word 'looked' or the 'er' sound in them such as farmer?

Speed write- Go outside with a paint brush and water or chalk and set a timer- how many times can you write 'looked' or 'er' words can you write in 1 minute?

Choose a favourite book and be a digraph spotter! How many 'er' words did you find? How many times did you find 'looked'.

Now with the 'er' words you have made, wrote and read think of a silly sentence to put them in. For example "Amber is a farmer." Can you extend these sentences but using conjunctions such as 'and' or 'because'. For example "Amber is a farmer and she likes looking after her pigs." Don't forget capital letters and full stops and include the tricky word if possible!

<u>Fluency</u> – Label these coins. Remember to use p for pence and £ for pounds.
