Phonics- 'ir' and 'asked'

Today we are going to continue to focus on the 'er' family pattern and focus on the 'ir' digraph which mainly appears in the middle of a word and the tricky word 'asked'.

Can you make some words out of lego or construction with tricky word 'asked' or the 'ir' digraph in them such as bird?

Speed write- Go outside with a paint brush and water or chalk and set a timer- how many times can you write 'asked' or 'ir' words can you write in 1 minute? If you don't have chalk, don't worry use a pencil and paper.


Choose a favourite book and be a digraph spotter! How many 'ir' words did you find? How many times did you find 'asked'.

Now with the 'ir' words you have made, wrote and read think of a silly sentence to put them in. For example: "Mr Twirl spotted the bird first."

Can you extend these sentences by using conjunctions such as 'and' or 'because'.

For example "Mr Twirl spotted the bird first and asked someone what type of bird it was." Don't forget capital letters and full stops and include the tricky word if possible!
