

What do BC and AD mean?

BC and AD are letters often found at the end of dates written in years such as...

31BC Augustus became the Roman Emperor **AD79** Eruption of Mount Vesuvius in Pompeii




Before Christ and Anno Domini





This method of dating years is called the Gregorian Calendar. It started life as the Roman Catholic Calendar, which was introduced by the Romans.





BC refers to the years that come before the year 1.

AD refers to the years from year 1 onwards.



Did You Know...?


There is no year 0!
The year 1 BC is followed by AD 1.





1BC 1AD


BC AD

What about Non-Christians?

Even though the counting of years all over the world usually uses this system, other religions do still count dates in their own years...


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How do other religions record dates?

Other religions do still use their own calendar for religious dates:





Calendars for Christians, Jews and Muslims, will be recognised like this:

AD 2017 ("In the Year of the Lord") for Christianity. AM 5772 ("In the Year of the World") for Judaism. AH 1433 ("In the Year of the Hijra") for Islam.

What about now, when there are so many different faiths and non-faiths?

Just so people do not get confused, around the world the BC/AD calendar is still used. However, more often than not, its letters have changed a little bit...

BC = BCE BCE means 'Before the Common Era'

> AD = CE CE means 'Common Era'

'Common Era' basically means the time when we are all counting the same. This is a good way of keeping the same dates but making the letters non-religious.





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
