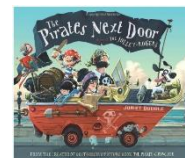


Reception Home Learning w/c 8th June 2020

Argghh we pirates love to use maps, could you make a map and find treasure this week me hearties? Read on to find out more!

Swanfishers-Below you will find this week’s tasks that should keep you busy. You might need some help to get started but you should be able to complete most of them by yourself.

Phonics	We will upload a daily phonics sound, video link and activity to Dojo. As we are in the revision stages it may seem that we are covering the same sounds repeatedly; this is intentional.
Reading	Play buried treasure on phonics play. Pick any digraph from phase 3 and have a go at reading the words. It is then up to you to decide if the word is real or made up and if it belongs in the trash or treasure chest!
Writing	Using the pirate you created last week could you write a sentence about him/her? Perhaps it could be something that your pirate likes doing or a sentence about what he or she likes to eat.
Maths	-Continue to practise daily counting to 10 in 2s and count to 100 in 10s (you could use objects to support and show the counting visually – you could use some gold coins or gems) - Have a go at creating your own repeating pattern. You could do this outside using objects such as leaves and stones or you could use shapes, toys or paints inside to create a pattern. Be as creative as you like.
Art and Creative	Have some fun using chalk. Could you draw a picture of a pirate ship? Or maybe even a pirate? Enjoy chalking outside if you wish, it is great fun to chalk in big spaces.
Understanding the world	Pirates use maps a lot! Could you create a map of the immediate area outside of your house? You could get family members to use your map or maybe you could even hide some treasure for them to find using your map for clues!
Physical Development	Can you practise some balancing skills and pretend to walk the plank like a pirate? Either while out on a walk find a log or a thin bit of path to balance on or create something to walk and balance on in your garden or house.
PSED	Play a board game with your family. If you don’t have one then you could have a go at making one to play together. Practise taking turns as you play.
Mental health and life skills	Spend the day talking like a pirate me hearties! See if you can research some pirate words with a grown up, some of them sound pretty funny!
