Monday	Revision	Quickwrite: Parents please choose 6 digraphs or trigraphs for your child to write as quickly as possible in 1 minute! Tuesday	Revision	Compound words: Please read the following words for your child to have a try at writing. These are longer words made up of two shorter words and may be a challenge but the idea is to have a try at hearing as many sounds as possible and to build confidence in reading and writing longer words, Break up the word first into its two parts before writing: Raincoat Earring Catfish	Match the picture and caption. Step 1- print out the pictures and caption. Or pick 3 and draw the pictures and write the captions to match. Step 2 – cut out a few matching pictures and captions (please don't do them all in one go, There's lots to choose from) Step 3 – place the pictures and captions out in front of your child Step 4- encourage them to read the caption and then find the picture to match what they have read.
