Message from the Head Teacher

Brilliant behaviour

The children in our school are responding well to the new behaviour policy. In our recent survey, the children said they felt safe and happy in school and that they felt that they were supported if they had any concerns about bullying.

They had some great suggestions too, and in response we have:

- Cleaned the corner of the MUGA pitch so that it is less slippery and have removed the board so the water can drain away
- Spent £1500 on new playground equipment so there is much more to play with and enjoy
- Focused our celebration certificates around our core values of Kindness, Perseverance and Success. The children have been promoting 'Kindness' by using kind words and being nice to each other.
- Used the assembly this week to encourage and promote 'Respect' of others and our environment which enforces our school rules of being Ready, Respectful and Safe.

Local Authority Visit

Two of the LA's school improvement team came to visit us yesterday. They were really impressed with what they saw in the school and commented on how focused the children were in their learning right across the school. We know our hard work is paying off and the children have made a great start to their new year groups this term.



What have the children been up to at school?



Year 6 have been working extremely hard in their computing lessons this term to code, debug and use computational thinking to produce their very own game. Using a range of design features, combined with a layered approach, outcomes looked absolutely super! This is an example of Dalia's game which involved a turtle crossing the road – it worked tremendously well!



Owl class celebrated #helloyellow day by wearing yellow and having fun in the afternoon with games, listening to yellow themed songs and creating posters. They played a circle game of fruit salad with yellow fruits and then a child adapted 'Duck, Duck, Goose' to 'Hello Yellow' where the children said Hello to each child but when they said 'Yellow' the children raced around the circle back to their place in the circle. They enjoyed being together and talking about how they can be happy and find their Yellow!

Year 1 have been learning about Mindfulness as part of our 5 ways to well-being- Take Notice. The children were able to control their breathing and stopping to see how their bodies felt. They started with their hands and how the palms felt tickly and if they rubbed their hands together they could make them warm. The children then thought about eating mindfully and spoke about stopping and appreciating food. They had raisins and cheerio's and instead of just chewing and swallowing them they smelt them, looked at the texture on them, popped them in their mouths but did not chew them then finally they chewed slowly. The children agreed the raisins and cheerio's tasted so much better! Have a go at home!





'In Year 2 we've been thinking about how to be kind when playing with our friends at break and lunchtimes. We've learnt a variety of playground games which we are now enjoying playing everyday with new and old friends. This has linked to our PSHE lessons where we have discussed ways we can 'Connect' with people to help those around us and our own wellbeing.'

Thanks to help from Wild Hogs Rescue in Frampton Year 3 have been enjoying investigating the life of hedgehogs. Last month the children set traps to see if we have any resident hedgehogs...and it's official! We have at least 2 healthy animals visiting our grounds! This week the children were given a virtual tour of the Wild Hogs Rescue where they saw how the centre cares for injured and orphaned hoglets.

Extra care required at level crossings - including half term

Sunday 25 October - Friday 6 November inclusive

We are carrying out work in the Bristol area which will mean all freight trains and some passenger trains will be diverted via Gloucester. Due to this, there will be an increase in high-speed trains on the line that runs near your child's school every day during this period.

Please take extra care while using the level crossings. Where there are barriers, please allow extra time to travel as they will be down more often than usual. For more information on level crossing use, please visit: networkrail.co.uk/level-crossings

Due to the increase in trains, you may also hear slightly more noise than normal.

What the work involves

We are working on behalf of South Gloucestershire Council to replace the railway bridge at Gipsy Patch Lane, near Patchway station in Bristol, to help improve public transport in that area.

Beware: Increased train traffic at level crossings

Engineering work in the Bristol area means trains are being diverted via Gloucester between 24 October and 7 November.

Network Rail is working on behalf of South Gloucestershire Council to replace a railway bridge as part of the council's Cribbs Patchway metrobus extension project. The work means that there will be a significant increase in high-speed trains on the line in this area on every day between 24 October and 7th November, as all freight trains and some passenger trains will be diverted via Gloucester.

Please take extra care at and around level crossings. Where there are barriers, please allow extra time to travel as they will be down more often than usual.
