For the past couple of weeks the children have been learning We're Going on a Bear hunt by Michael Rosen and this led to a fun filled Friday afternoon as Kingfisher's visited the Wild Garden. **The Elf on the Shelf**



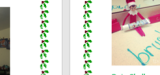
Far, far away in the northern hemisphere there is a magical place, which is cold and icy. The trees are covered in snow and the idyllic lights sparkle and gleam.

2) Look at paragraph 2. What do you think this paragraph is about?

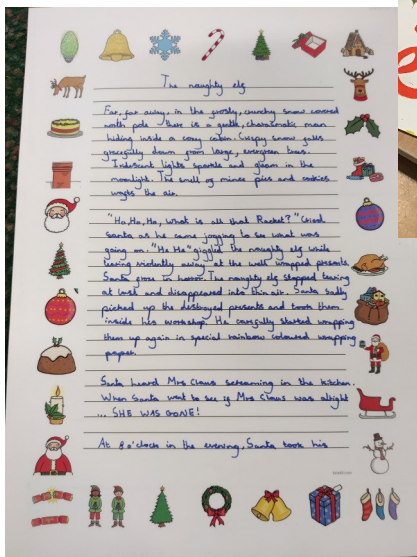
3) How does the second paragraph make you feel about this person? Use evidence to support your explanation.

4) Write in the speech bubble what you think the elf may be saying. Use the evidence in Paragraph 2 to support you.



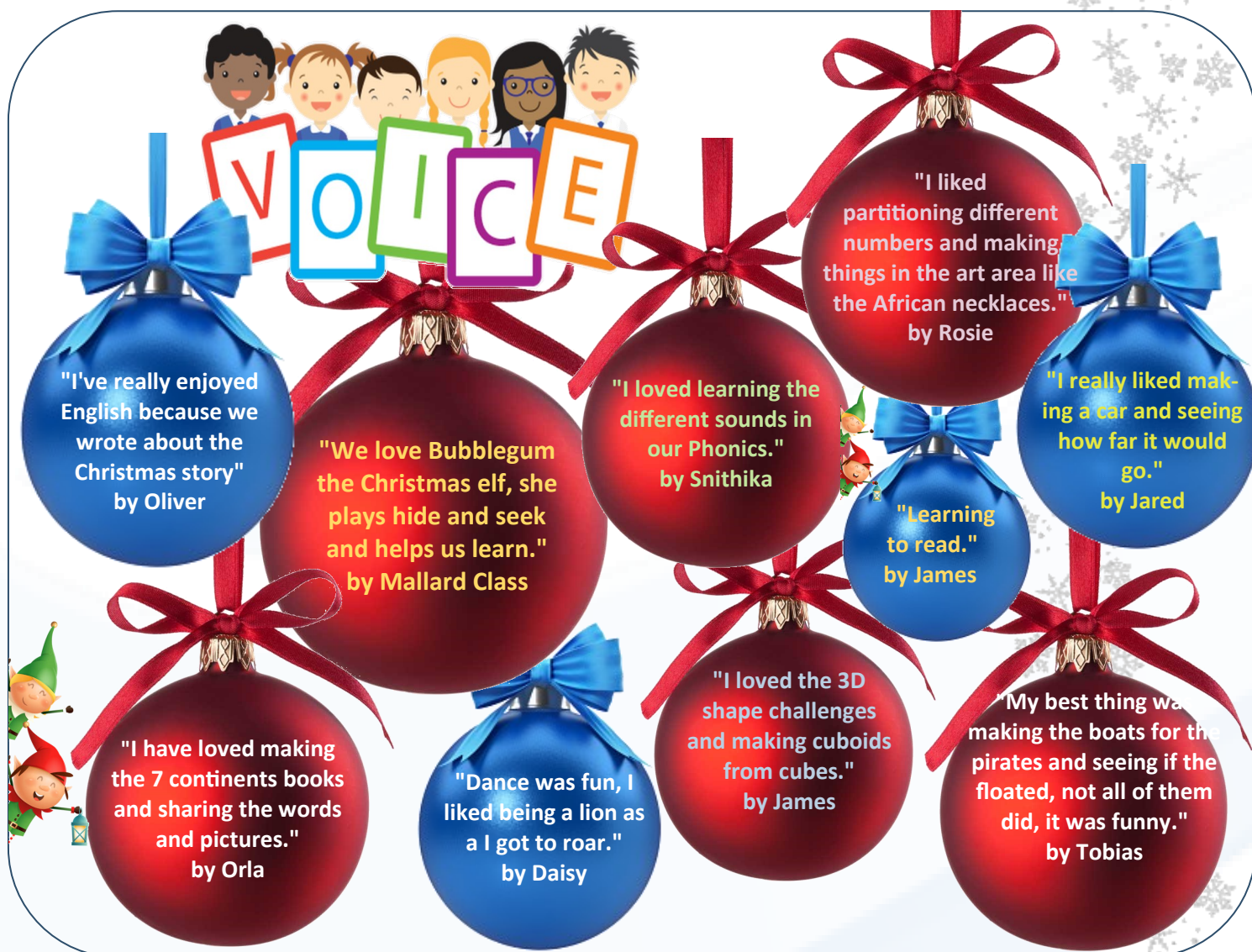
Open Challenge: Write a diary from the view of an elf on the shelf who lives in your home. What adventures would he get up to? Use the text to help you.

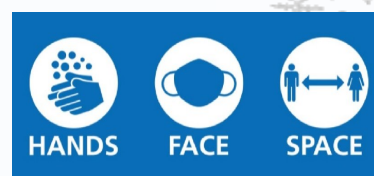
## School Admission Information
