- 1) Today we are recapping the digraph "ch". Watch Mr Thorne and Geraldine in this video (<https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=SEoednLrsMY>) and then have a go at the roll and read in the next picture, your child knows they should roll the dice and then read the word next to the corresponding number. Once you have read them, play again but this time practice letter formation and copy each word onto a piece of paper. - 2) Sing along to the shape song <https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=WTegUeif3D0&list=PL1s1t7p172nG2s3WEqLyGDTfVz3jU47pt> Now go on a hunt to find 2d shapes in your house. Take photos or draw pictures of the things you have found. How many circles did you find? How many shapes with 4 sides? What was the biggest shape you found?

Can you draw me a picture and upload a video of you telling me why? Listen to the story again, do you still like this bit the best? Did you change your mind?
