Message from the Headteacher

The school term is well underway with the children working hard across the school. The easing of restrictions in the first couple of weeks was a breath of fresh air for all us: enjoying singing, lunchtimes together in the hall and assemblies reminding us of how school should really feel.



Unfortunately, due to a number of cases in school, we have implemented a number of measures for a short period and when numbers reduce again, we will reduce our restrictions. I am aware that many schools are

experiencing the same issues; a flexible approach like this may be something we need to get used to for the time being.

I am truly sorry though for the disruption caused to you and we remain continually optimistic that plans, although postponed or changed, will only be cancelled as a last resort.

New Parents

I am most acutely aware of those parents who are new to our school. We are so keen to meet with you in person and give you a tour of the school - we promise it will be worth it when it finally does happen!

Parents' Evening

We had an even split in response to the questionnaire with equal numbers requesting face-to-face meetings, online meetings or no preference. However, given the recent increase, we have decided to run this first parents' meeting online. When restrictions have reduced, we will open the school for classroom visits so you can see your child's work and their classroom in person.

Spotlight on Phonics

Top tips for supporting your child with phonics

It is now widely recognised that systematic synthetic phonics is the most efficient and effective approach for the vast majority of children in the early stages of learning to read. Therefore, it is vitally important that this is the approach that we use to support children in their earliest stages of reading in early years and ks1 and often into ks2.



At Kingsway, we have developed our own approach to the teaching of phonics following our school pacing document which can be found on the website here. Using this document, you will be able to see which sounds your child has been taught so far; your child will be given a reading book which contains the sounds and tricky words that they know.

When you are support your child to read using phonics, here are our top tips:

- 1) Ensure that your child is using 'pure' sounds e.g. 'mmmm' not 'muh' this will help them blend the sounds together more easily. <u>This video</u> demonstrates how the sounds should be spoken.
- 2) Tricky words are words that can't be sounded out easily e.g. 'the', 'one' and 'my'. These words we encourage children to read by sight whilst still drawing children's attention to the different parts of words.
- 3) Before reading their reading book, practise the sounds, tricky words and decodable words at the front or back of their book. This will prepare them for reading the rest of the book. In the early stages of reading (particularly in reception and year 1), aim to get your child to read their book three times we call this 'Three times to fluency' this can be done over 2-3 nights rather than in one sitting.





First read:

Practise the sounds and tricky words at the front of the book and then find them in the book. You may wish to read part of the book to your child at this stage to build their confidence.



Second read:

Ask your child to read their book on their own. When they can't read a word, encourage them to sound it out only telling them if they are completely stuck. This read may be a little stilted at times whilst your child reads new words.

Third read:

Ask your child to read their book one more time. This time they may be able to read their book more fluently. You could make a point of asking them to perform their reading perhaps by reading to another family member.

How does Oracy help the children?


Increases confidence, empowering students with the belief that their voice has value, developing the ability to articulate thoughts so others will listen.


Henry Mouse A Christmas Tale

Emotion Coaching helps children understand the different emotions they experience, why they occur, and how to handle them.

We are pleased to announce we have been selected to take part in the Gloucester Schools Partnership Emotion Coaching Project (GSPEC). Emotion Coaching UK (www.emotioncoachinguk.com) is working with us and this project is about introducing Emotion Coaching into our teaching and the wider school community. It is to promote children's health, wellbeing and learning.

We are offering a course to parents which will span over four sessions offering information about how Emotion Coaching works and how you can use the approach we use in school at home. This course is free to attend. We only have 15 spaces so it will be first come first serve. However, we will run the course again and will have a waiting list of any parents who do not get to attend this time. Unfortunately, the course is for adults only and involves discussions that are for adult ears only so we are unable to provide crèche facilities for this first course so you would need to find child care for any younger children in order to attend the course in this instance.

The date of the first session will be: 4th November 9:00-9:30 with other sessions TBA.
