# Message from the Headteacher

Welcome to this round up of the term.

It has been a very busy few months and there is much to celebrate as you will see from this letter.



I would like to thank the staff for their tireless dedication and support of every child and for their passion and determination to provide the best learning they can. The focus on developing teaching and learning continues: this term we have received training on supporting children with ADHD through the ADHD Foundation; promoting resilience in learning through task choice and language use to develop perseverance. Additionally, we have started to make use of the Great Teaching Toolkit (Professor Rob Coe) which identifies key strands of effective teaching and learning.

Next term, we have further training on Emotion Coaching, which will enable us to run training for parents too...more to follow in the summer term.

It has been exciting to see a key strand of the curriculum 'Opportunities to Experience' become more embedded providing our children with a wide range of new and exciting trips, visits and activities.


#### Oracy at Kingsway

#### **Busy Busy Busy**

This term has been full of hard work and fun. When reading Aliens Love Underpants, we had lots of fun making our own silly sentences using rhyming words and creating our own aliens. We've had great fun exploring the forest school area, getting covered in mud, making clay models and toasting marshmallows around the fire. We've learnt all about the United Kingdom and have created our own saltdough sculptures, inspired by Joan Miro. To end the term, we had a fantastic morning at Oxstall's sports centre where we got to practise lots of the skills we have learnt in PE.



This term, Year 6 welcomed Mrs Finnegan into class for a workshop. She talked to us about ecosystems, the threats that British wildlife face and shared animals from the museum collection. Year 6 then created posters about the impact climate change is having on our wildlife's habitats. The children all enjoyed the activity and their artwork will be displayed at The Wilson Museum on Saturday 22<sup>nd</sup> April, which is also Earth Day.



#### **Peer Mediators**

This year, we have trained twenty-one Year 6 pupils as Peer Mediators. Peer Mediators help other pupils resolve minor disputes during lunchtime periods. They have received five training sessions teaching life skills that can be implemented in restorative practices. These skills can help shape healthy attitudes towards conflicts they may face throughout life. The Peer Mediators have been doing an amazing job, demonstrating great maturity.
