Opportunities to demonstrate our Curriculum Drivers in Year 4 Autumn 2023

The Radical, Rotten Romans!

History/Geography

Become historians and discover why the Romans invaded Britain. What was life like as a Roman soldier? What did the Romans invent and how did these inventions affect our life today? Use historical sources to find out about the past. Use your geographical knowledge to find out where these fierce warriors came from. Look at how Gloucestershire has changed over time and discover why the Romans chose to live here. Understand more about our world through identifying countries, capital cities and hemispheres.

DT/Art

We will be developing our sketching skills and studying the famous artist Antoni Gaudi. Following this we will experiment with colour and collage to design our own Roman swords and mosaics. In DT we will learn to stitch and sew our own Roman stude purpose.

We will be exploring the Gamelan music, traditional
Indonesian music. We will also play, compose and perform
Gamelan style music.

PSHE
We will be looking at the five ways to wellbeing, and the importance of good mental health. We will also be learning about relationships, friends and family.

Which food groups give us energy? How healthy is your favourite snack? Why is it important to brush your teeth? What is democracy? What are your rights as a child? These are just a few things that we will be discussing and debating in PSHE.

French
Learn how to describe people using French adjectives and tell the time to impress your family.



Year 4 are studying the Roman invasion of Britain and discovering why the Romans chose to come to Gloucester and the impact this had on the inventions and

We are going to enjoy reading texts linked to the Romans such as 'A Street through Time'. We will use our imaginations to create poems and descriptions based on tales of Roman life. We will also learn how to write non-chronological reports using paragraphs and a range of sentence structures. 'The Pirate Cruncher' picture book will entertain us and allow us to experiment with literary language.

Maths
What's its value? In Year 4 we learn about 4 digit numbers and continue to improve and refine our calculations using all four operations (addition, subtraction, multiplication and division). Knowing all of your times tables is a really important part of year four. Do you know your 2D and 3D shapes? How many edges does a tetrahedron have? Learn to describe the properties of shapes.

Calling all scientists! Time to explore who lives where and why. We will explore habitats and how the organisms within a habitat exist together by investigating food webs

Where does food go once we eat it? What happens inside our digestive system? In Year 4 we will use our investigation skills to find out!

Physical Education

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Swimming! We will once again be swimming: with ten more lessons we are hoping to make great progress in Year 4 towards passing the NC requirements in Year 5.

During gymnastics lessons the children will also learn to lift and carry equipment carefully and safely.

Computing

Keeping safe on the internet is crucial; the children will learn how to stay safe online and why this is so important following our new digital futures resources with a focus on self-image and identity and online relationships. We will also be exploring computer systems and networks including the internet until half term and after half term we will learn how to create media with a focus on audio editing!
