

At Christmas, many Americans decorate their homes with Christmas lights. They outline their homes with strings of electric lights. The lights are often warm white or cool white, however, they can also be coloured.

The tradition of decorating homes with strings of electric lights is connected to the older tradition of decorating Christmas trees with candles. In 1882, an American inventor named Edward Hibberd Johnson, a friend of light-bulb inventor Thomas Edison, decorated a Christmas tree with strings of coloured electric lights instead of candles. However, the idea to decorate Christmas trees with electric lights did not catch on right away. Many Americans did not trust electricity, and electric lights were very expensive.

In 1895, President Grover Cleveland decorated a Christmas tree in the White House with Christmas lights. Since then, Christmas lights have become more and more popular in America. Many Americans also have figures like reindeers and snowmen made of Christmas lights outside their homes.




