YOUTH HUBS

Youth Hubs have been developed as part of the DWP Youth Offer to combat youth unemployment and ensure young people have the skills they need to find and secure employment.



All 16–24-year-olds who are looking for work are automatically eligible for the Youth Offer and will be supported through the DWP Youth Employment Programme. The offer to young people is made up of three key parts:

- 13 week Youth Employment Programme
- Access to Youth Employability Coaches
- Access to Youth Hubs

What is a DWP Youth Hub?

A Youth Hub is an agreed external provider site where DWP work coaches are based.

Nationwide, there are almost 120 Youth Hubs ready to work with employers and partners. Inside each hub, young people will have access to specialist youth employability coaches and tailored support.

Youth Hubs are not contained within Jobcentres which helps young people to feel more at ease.

Why should employers engage with DWP Youth Hubs?

A place for employers and partners to:

- Promote employment opportunities, including apprenticeships and open job vacancies.
- Participate in recruitment events / careers fairs.
- Recruit talent for work experience programmes.
- Deliver sector based insight days / training events.
