

The BMFA have been on Zoom again!

This time talking about Article 16 and having watched the zoom meeting I now think I understand what article 16 authorisation is....

.... So in the UK all flying is legislated via the CAA and their rules cover everybody (and everything) that flies with only a few exceptions paper aeroplanes for example us aero-modellers are firmly included.



.... So following the most recent legislative changes and some 'arguably' rushed amendments following 'potential' 'quadcopter' miss-use the UK published new rules CAP 722, this now being the primary guidance document for the operation of unmanned 'aircraft' within the UK.

Some CAP 722 rules would have damaged our established sport so the BMFA using it's collective power (all of us) negotiated with the CAA on our behalf and agreed article 16 authorisation, this special agreement allow us, as BMFA members to carry on flying pretty well as we always have, as long as we show and prove our competency.

Of course, there are many other article 16s, article 16 was also in the news recently when the EU invoked it re. Northern Ireland and vaccine imports, that was obviously nothing to do with model flying !!!

I also learnt whilst watching the presentation, that, in theory any accident or incident we have while flying should be notified to the AAIB! Yes... in theory every heavy landing, engine failure or tree interaction should be reported. Watch the above presentation to see what the BMFA guys have to say on the matter.

Just a reminder don't forget you need to have your number CAA registration number on your models, it's the law!
