When learning to fly we will often ask an instructor or fellow flyer to test fly our models or use a buddy-lead to take over our early flights in case anything should go

wrong. If you ask a fellow member to operate as your buddy, or test your model you do so at your own risk, no experienced club pilot would put your model at risk, but accidents do happen.

I LEARNT A NEW FLYING TERM - Pilot Flying (PF) and Pilot Monitoring (PM)

When two pilots fly a fixed-wing aeroplane which requires a two-person flight crew, the aircraft commander, who must be appropriately qualified and hold the rank of Captain, will normally occupy the left hand seat and the First Officer or Co-Pilot will normally occupy the right hand seat.









WHO KNEW THERE WERE SO MANY SERVO SIZES.

I'm currently building a tiny indoor model and needed a small servo I didn't realise there were so many different sizes of 'small' servos. And... in the end this list didn't include the actual size I needed, mine are even smaller!!

Servo Size Explained

by Motion RC February 18 2018

RC servos are categorized into six standard sizes shown in the table below. To help you select the correct servo for your project we have included an approximate weight and size specifications for each servo category. Please note, servos can vary from these guidelines, so always check the product page for detailed specifications.
