Committee News

Here we are at the beginning of another year and looking back January was a bit of a write off due to the rather inclement weather. Currently, February is not looking much better either. This has made gathering up our usual members has been a bit difficult but so far we have managed to enrol over 50 to date. That is quite normal for this time of year. A few more are expected to re-join once the weather improves.

Personnel Changes

There have been some changes to the committee since the AGM. Firstly, those who attended that meeting will know that there were no nominations for Safety Officer, so Dave Hoppe agreed to take on the role on a temporary basis in addition to his Site Representative duties. Fortunately, Geoff Griffiths has since volunteered to do the job, so all safety issues will be dealt with by him from now on.

The second change is that Joe Humphries has stepped down for personal reasons after 22 years loyal service to the club. We all owe him a vote of thanks for his hard work during that time and the committee will miss his contribution greatly. Geoff Scott will take over the editorship of the Newsletter in addition to database management, and Roger Stanton will assist him by taking over the membership paperwork for the time being.

Flying Sites

Those who attended the AGM will know about the club's interest in the Portsmouth club's flying site. This started when we heard that PADMAC were considering winding up their club because of dwindling membership and financial difficulties. Since then PADMAC have decided to keep going, but have not ruled out an informal Firebird proposal to share their site. The advantage to PADMAC is that we would share the cost of the site. In turn, we would benefit from access to a decent 7 days a week site at a lower cost than renting a second site just for ourselves. Because one of the key

PADMAC players is away on business in the USA, formal discussions have not yet taken place, but we will keep you posted.

The above does not mean that we have given up looking for a second site, but until the way forward with the PADMAC proposal is known (hopefully before the end of the month) the search will be lower key. As explained to a number of members after the AGM, the second site search started with approaches to local authorities at Eastleigh, Winchester and county level. These did not bear fruit as most of the suitable land available was used for playing fields. Apart from being very expensive to rent, it seems people are continually using them for boring footie games etc.

When it comes to council owned farm land, we again drew a blank including at Manor Farm (we've almost lost count of the times we've tried to get a site there). Incidentally, one of the reasons we started with the local authorities is that we believed they should be the ideal landlord. For example, planning permission would not be an issue. However, the latest BMFA guidance on finding site states that of all types of landlord, the BMFA deals with more problems involving local authorities than any other!

One of the important issues when looking for a site is that the BMFA recommend a separation distance of at least 2 miles between clubs that use of 35MHz gear. Therefore an Ordnance Survey map has been marked up with 2-mile radius circles around the sites of all known model clubs in the area, including our own at Poplars. Another circle has been drawn around the full-size aircraft strips at Roughay Farm and Lower Upham.

The controlled airspace around Eastleigh Airport has also been taken into account. Assuming we want a site south of the A272 and preferable west of the A32, there are only two "corridors" that are available – ie they have suitable land that doesn't encroach on other clubs airspace. The first is between Curbridge, Burridge and Fareham, but we've contacted every suitable farm in this area without success.

The second corridor is about 5 miles wide and extends north from Corehampton through Kilmeston to Hinton Ampner on the A272. It is bounded in the west by the Winchester Club and the Lower Upham/Roughhay airfields. To the east, the boundary is defined by the PADMAC site and the Petersfield site at Chidden Down. It is in this second corridor that we will continue our search once the outcome of the PADMAC approach is decided.

It was a beautiful sunny and mostly calm day. Whilst the wind remained fairly light most of the time, there were some bumpy cross-wind conditions from about 11am onwards.

The biggest problem we faced was the waterlogged strip. For example, the take-off run with this Extra 260 was a bit alarming as it barely reached air speed by the end of the strip. The little wheels carved two ruts into the soft surface, adding a huge amount

drag to the process. Upon touch-down the plane came to an immediate dead stop in a brown mist. Here's how the underside looked afterwards.
