Bank Holidays

For all days except bank holiday Mondays, flying times are the same as normal (see above tables). On bank holiday Mondays, Saturday hours apply i.e. 10am to 2pm. The reasoning behind this is to avoid annoying our "neighbours" when they may be relaxing in their gardens. These times were also declared to Winchester Council when we were granted our Lawful Development Certificate, which is effectively planning permission for our model flying. The only other bank holiday anomaly is Christmas Day when no flying is allowed, whichever day of the week it falls on.

Committee News

Here's the latest from the committee room.

Christmas Party Thursday 10TH Dec

Don't forget that the Christmas Party will take place on Thursday, i.e. 10th Dec, 7.30pm for an 8.00pm start. This is a family affair so please persuade the missus/girlfriend/boyfriend/kids to come along.

There will be a buffet supper at no charge, but bring some money for a last flutter on the raffle! There will be over £750 worth of prizes, mostly aero-modelling related, but there will also be boxes of biscuits, bottles of wine etc.

Model kits will include a WOT 4 foamie, a Black Horse Renegade, a scale YAK and Sea Fury. Before the buffet starts, a vote will be taken on the Committee's proposal for 2016 subs (see below for more details). After the buffet, trophies for 2016 will be awarded and this will be followed by the raffle draw.

2016 Subscriptions

At the BMFA AGM last month, it was agreed that the BMFA adult subscription for 2016 would go up by £1 to £33. The Junior subscription would remain the same (£17) as would the Family subscriptions (Senior £33, Junior £13).

The Firebird Committee discussed the club subscriptions at its meeting on 3rd Dec and decided to recommend an increase for Seniors of £4, making it £72. The reasons for the proposed increase are that the site rent has gone up by £40 a month and it is anticipated that a significant amount will have to be spent on the mower in 2016.

Safety Matters

There's no safety matters this month

Fly Past - Ripmax Acrowot Mk2 ARTF

Justin has been kind enough to write a review of the Ripmax Acrowot.

The Acrowot is second Chris **Foss** designed plane to be produced mass sold as an ARTF model by Ripmax. Like their first ARTF offering the wot 4 this kit has sold by the truck load and is a common sight at many Indeed several clubs. Firebirds members including myself have and most one about them. I think at the Beaulieu club its



actually part of the membership criteria to own one, and when I saw seven of them being flown at once down there I was unsure that any of the pilots could have been 100% sure that they were flying their own model at times but they all landed safely (just!)

The plane itself is a little different to the original Foss kit having a slightly longer wingspan and the wing is built up rather than the foam veneer found in the traditional kit. Also I believe the ARTF is a little longer and incorporates the tail modification that was introduced in the home build to stop "fish tailing" during acceleration. This is when the tail seems to gyrate and become unstable for a moment. (The ARTF still does this a bit)

So onto what you get for your money? Well the airframe itself is pretty solid for an ARTF, the covering is ok but does peel a little over time. The only real issue being the fittings kit, this lets it down a bit and you may find yourself replacing some of the cheap sub-standard items supplied. The tank is not the best either and failures at the bung seem common.

On to the power plant and I along with many others at the field and on the forums find a 70 four stroke to be the ideal motor for the plane, a 91 can be squeezed in and indeed less nose ballast weight would then be needed to balance but the 70 is ample performance wise. The airframe engine bay /mount position doesn't suit all two stroke designs and it seems common to have to hack away at the firewall & fuselage creating a tunnel to allow room for the muffler to be fitted. Rob Cope made a nice job of this on his incorporating foil heat shielding, but he now seems to have gone for the

favoured 70 four stroke. I believe the latest imported models will feature a battery hatch so it will be interesting to see how it performs with an electric set up.

Flying the Acrowot is a lot of fun and traditional aerobatic manoeuvres such as Cuban eights and Immelmann turns are a real joy as the plane tracks so well. Some suggest the plane as a second model after the high wing trainer has been mastered, But I personally wouldn't & especially not at confined fields like Poplars as the planes aren't the lightest and can be a bit slippery therefore tricky to slow down especially from height; e.g. an approach from the far left over the trees.

So for under£130 plus some new fittings you will have a very capable aerobat and an airframe that actually prefers a little wind over a flat calm day. And remember that as it comes over the edge of the strip still going at 30 mph, clenching your buttocks won't actually slow it down physically but it will certainly help mentally.
