[Note 1: 'QF' means Quiet Flight. That is gliders and electric models.]

[Note 2: Finish times are either as stated above or at sundown - whichever comes first. No night flying is permitted.]

Bank Holidays

For all days except bank holiday Mondays, flying times are the same as normal (see above tables). On bank holiday Mondays, Saturday hours apply i.e. 10am to 2pm. The reasoning behind this is to avoid annoying our "neighbours" when they may be relaxing in their gardens. These times were also declared to Winchester Council when we were granted our Lawful Development Certificate, which is effectively planning permission for our model flying. The only other bank holiday anomaly is Christmas Day when no flying is allowed, whichever day of the week it falls on.

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Committee News

Here's the latest from the committee room.

Debris on the Strip

To avoid expensive damage to the mower, please make sure you don't leave broken prop blades or other debris on the strip. This is even more important in the spring and summer months when the mower is set for a closer cut.

Parking

For safety reasons now that there are some parking places adjacent to the pits, please make sure you don't encroach onto the area that has been mown. This will also give other members in the pits some "elbow room". Additionally, as a matter of courtesy, if you have large I/C models please select an area of the pits away from the caravan and seats.

Noise

Our Lawful Development Certificate gives us a measure of security at Poplars Farm, so having spent well over £1000 to get it, we don't want to risk being evicted because of noise complaints. Therefore, the committee has decided to bring out the Noise Meter whenever they judge that a model may be over the BMFA/Department of the Environment noise limit. If a model is found to be over the 82 dBa limit the committee can give advice on how to reduce the noise to an acceptable level.

Future Club Nights

April 21st - Table top sale. Bring those unwanted items to raise some cash. The should also be some bargains to spend it on. If you have a new model, even if only half built, bring it along to show the rest of us. If space allows, it may be possible to do a little indoor flying.

May 19th - Barbeque at the site. As Thursday evening isn't a normal flying time, only genuinely quiet electric models will be permitted to fly.

June - Hopefully a barbeque at Roughay Farm

July/August – Barbeques on either the third Monday or Friday of the month, depending on the weather. If both days are poor, then there will be an informal gathering at the Hamble Club.

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Down at the Field

As reported in last month's newsletter, we finally got a break in the weather on 12th and 13th March. It was sunny and calm and ideal for flying.

On the 13th Andre, a new joiner, started flying with the Firebirds. Andre had noticed our website while looking for a good site for his electric powered warbirds. These were: a Seagull P47, a Seagull Super Tucano a VQ Kawasaki Hien, a FW190 and VQ Dauntless, all packed into the back of his van. Clearly he is a keen warbird fan.

His Seagull P47 was brand new and being a little apprehensive about the first flight, Andre asked if I would take on that challenge. It was clearly well built and flew beautifully straight away, requiring only minor trim. If you're thinking about buying one, then my brief experience revealed that the plane;

- 1) gave nice slow axial rolls,
- 2) had a fairly gentle stall, which always tipped to one side,
- 3) on landing it required power all the way down to the strip but would do a three-pointer if judged right (I failed) this was in a 10mph headwind,
- 4) looks great.

The previous owner had said the plane was a "pussycat" so Andre had no qualms about doing the first flight himself. What followed was like a ride on a bucking bronco strapped to a rollercoaster. 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

Fly Past

Chris Fisher joined Firebirds last year and has kindly written a diary or blog of his membership experience. I shall publish other instalments over the next couple of newsletters.

My First Year (6 months) with the Firebirds....

Having known Firebirds Committee member Russell Lewis for more years than I want to remember (basically since I married his sister) It was only a matter of time before I had a go at flying fixed wing models and joining the firebirds model flying club. Once joining I realised what a thankless job it must be finding something new to write each month in the Newsletter, so I thought I would help pad it out !! Here goes....

My first real experience of the model world was when Russell dragged me along to Sandown race course where there was a yearly Model show complete with a flying display, these Sandown shows stopped some 10 years ago, so that shows how long ago it really was. We went year after year to these shows including increasingly longer

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journeys to places like Hop farm in Kent and most recently Weston Park just North of Birmingham.

At the first few shows I just watched while Russell made purchases and talked about ailerons, glow fuel and dihedral (I didn't have a clue what dihedral was), I just kept him company and bought burgers, hotdogs and a drink or two. Eventually I did dip a toe in the water a bought a helicopter, it was a clever design by Snellflight and used an umbilical cord so you could learn indoors without the need for batteries or refuelling. I never mastered it and it went in a cupboard, that was probably 15 years ago, but don't worry I will keep the story short!

As a spectator I watched the hobby evolve and change, but most important for me I saw the introduction of Li-Po battery technology, brushless motors and affordable 2.4Ghz transmitters I had always been afraid of those messy oily IC engines, those easily damaged shiny aerials and the time involved in building an aeroplane from a plan and a pile of Balsa wood and tissue.

Everything came together for me in 2015 I bought an electric CUB plane complete with brushless motor, prop and fitted servos in the 'bring and buy' sale at that Weston park Model Show I mentioned. A quick look around the trade tents and I bought me a New Spektrum Dx6i transmitter and receiver. I was ready to go and all under £200, even better news by joining Firebirds half way through the year even that was half price so everything was just perfect. Well almost....
