Bank Holidays

For all days except bank holiday Mondays, flying times are the same as normal (see above tables). On bank holiday Mondays, Saturday hours apply i.e. 10am to 2pm. The reasoning behind this is to avoid annoying our "neighbours" when they may be relaxing in their gardens. These times were also declared to Winchester Council when we were granted our Lawful Development Certificate, which is effectively planning permission for our model flying. The only other bank holiday anomaly is Christmas Day when no flying is allowed, whichever day of the week it falls on.

Fly Past

Roger's Hurricane IID



After 12 months work Roger has finally finished his Hurricane Mk IID. It is the "tank buster" variant fitted with two 40mm cannon for anti-tank work in North Africa during World War II.

It is built from a Brian Taylor plan supplied by Russell Lewis, and Pete Clark cut the foam wings. Pete also suggested using emulsion tester pots from B&Q for the paintwork, which went on very well using a small paint roller. The roller was also used for the final coat of fuel proof(ish) matt polyurethane varnish - who needs spray gun?

All roundels etc. are hand painted using Humbrol enamels. Despite cheating by lengthening the nose slightly, a lot of lead was needed to achieve a safe CofG, with the result that Roger's twenty seven year old OS70 four stroke lacks the power to get the beast into the air safely. If anyone has a spare 90 four stroke, please give Roger a call!
