Last months - FIRST AID DEMONSTRATION



A BIG THANK YOU to Dave Dewey and his son Chris both volunteers with the ambulance service for their First Aid lecture and demonstration on Thursday 16th November.

The 'Dewey Duo' put together a really informative evening demonstrating their knowledge and passion in helping people involved in medical trauma. The evening went really quickly and although done in a light hearted and down to earth way covered some really serious potential situations from minor cuts to the use of public defibrillators.

Dave suggested that we all download an app to our smart phones that show the location of your nearest defibrillator <<u>LINK></u>. The app confirms that there is one available at Corehampton Golf club. Another useful app for communicating with the emergency services in a 'discreet' way was recommend, ideal for teenagers out on their own just in case they get into a difficult situation <<u>LINK></u>.

Note: Dave also mentioned that IC fuels may contain some nasty chemicals, if you do cut yourself and there is a chance of fuel contamination please mention this to whoever treats you.

Peak Down flying times

Mon – Fri 1200 – Dusk Sat – Sun 1000 – 1600.

A couple of important things to note

- Take care when driving to the pits as there may be bumps and ruts hidden in the longer grass.
- Please shut and lock the gate if you are the last member leaving the site.
- Please consider taking first aid equipment with you as there will be no facility on-site
- You should also keep a mobile phone with you in case of an accident.
- Please, Please, Please show extra consideration to our new neighbours, please fly considerately especially during the initial 'honeymoon' period.

Don't forget there is no charging facility on site so make sure you take plenty of batteries or a charging facility with you.

Advance notice - Known motocross dates (subject to change)

Other dates will be announced as they arise, potentially with short notice

Safety reminder

Peak Down - with the expanded flying times it is also more likely that members will fly on their own sometimes.

This is not banned by club rules, but if you fly on your own it is at your own risk. You should keep a mobile phone with you in case of an accident, especially if you need to go searching for a lost model

Please consider putting a first aid kit in your car.



An excerpt from the BMFA Members Handbook 2017

5.10 Personal Accident Insurance

(a) Members of the BMFA between the ages of 3 and 85 are covered by a standard personal accident policy whilst participating in Association activities which include the building and flying of model aircraft for sport and recreational purposes as well as travel to and from the flying site.

(b) Personal Accident Cover is extended to cover first time visitors to a club who have no previous experience but who are seeking to try out model flying prior to joining the club and BMFA. Indemnity under this 'First Time Inexperienced Flyer' provision will only be in place when flights are being totally organised and supervised by a suitable club member approved by the Club Committee. The limit of this indemnity is 3 separate day visits for any single inexperienced flyer.

Others using Peak down site:

Access to Peak down is only available to the man who farms the lower end of the field, the Firebirds who have the lock combination and the tree surgeons that deliver the wood chippings. Nobody else has a right to access the site the test will always be do they have the key code for the lock.

Rob Exall went to the Peak down site during the month and found the gate open and a van parked across the entrance, 2 further vehicles were parked down by the Motocross course where men were working. Rob and his brother were rightly annoyed as they had driven all the way to the site. He contacted Roger.

Roger replied on behalf of the committee.. "If the gate had been opened then it must have been someone associated with the motocross club who had the lock combination. You should have asked them to let you in as we are paying good money for access to the site. If it happens again and they refuse, then by all means call me or any other member of the committee (phone numbers at the end of each newsletter)."

Hopefully these are just teething problems but please keep committee members informed so we can deal with and advise appropriately.

You need to be aware of is that although the motocross competition preparations normally take place on the Saturday, occasionally some work will be done during the previous week.

Should you come across this situation you still have the right to access the site (your knowledge of the gate combination is proof of this) but it is your responsibility to assess whether it is safe to fly.

If you believe it is unsafe then you can always ask them nicely to move their vans etc, but the bottom line is that if they can't or won't you must not fly.


Captions anybody ?


