ick Payne's Constellations is a wonderful insight into how simple decisions can change the course of your life - the way you react, a quip you make, a look you give someone, whether you go to a party - alongside how many possibilities exist because of those decisions.

The official précis of the play starts "A quantum physicist and a beekeeper meet at a barbeque. They hit it off, or perhaps they don't. They go home together, or maybe they go their separate ways..." and this is a delicious taster of what's to come.

All of these possibilities happen within the play.

The Many Worlds Theory might seem confusing, but it's quite simple really. Here's one explanation:

Every time a "random" event takes place, the universe splits between the various options available. Each separate version of the universe contains a different outcome of that event. Instead of one continuous timeline, the universe under the many worlds interpretation looks more like a series of branches splitting off of a tree limb.

his evening I was invited to a dress rehearsal for Teignmouth Players production of Constellations. The play is directed by **AI Dunn** (director of the 2023 production of **TWO**) so I knew it was going to be an experience that should not be missed.

Upon arrival, you walk into the theatre and head up the stairs to the bar area leading to the performance space where the scene has been set for the play. You may not understand why until you leave, but as you walk into the performance space you are surrounded by stars - totally transported to outer space in every way.

At the very start, the introduction sets the scene for what is a beautifully presented play.

The story follows two people, Marianne (played by Emma Firth) and Roland (played by Sam Merrell) and their various journeys through life.

They both played their parts with such ease and showed a real connection on stage.

I want to give a special mention to Emma for portraying Marianne's frustration at life's challenges with the grace and dignity it truly deserved. I think the way that Sam played the character of Roland suited him completely. The way he explained the inner workings of a beehive whilst trying to tell Marianne his true feelings was particularly impressive and made me laugh out loud.

The lighting throughout the play was simple and yet so effective which again is a credit to Al Dunn. One of the most stunning things about this production is how it plays with all of your emotions.

One moment you could be laughing out loud and then in an instant have tears streaming down your face.

As I left the theatre I started to think about the 'what if' moments that have happened (or have never happened) in my life.

A cosmic masterpiece from director Al Dunn which needs to be seen to be believed.

Well done to the cast and crew of this emotive and powerful play.



THE LAST 5 YEARS

his is a somewhat unknown musical to many and one which is seldom performed on the amateur scene, which is a travesty in its own right as it is one of the finest pieces of modern writing this decade.

Set as a two hander, the actors have an enormous weight of responsibility placed on them to ensure the story is effectively told, and with **Jen Parker** as Cathy (with **Claire Waring** playing Cathy in the first week) and **Jonathan Bisby** as Jamie, we were treated to exactly this.

This production is almost exclusively musically based (with minimal dialogue interjections) and their powerful performances of each and every memorable song kept the audience engaged at all times with strong interpretation of the nuances and meaning of each song shown throughout.

Joanna Walling had clearly drilled the actors to the max with regard to the singing, and **Rob** Walling, likewise, with the acting. That said, each were given license to make the characters their own and this added warmth and reality to the parts. This show also allows the removal of the fourth wall and invites the audience (sat in

the round) into the whole show, becoming confidantes, almost voyeuristic in nature, of their lives being played out in a Benjamin Button-esque manner with only one moment where the characters come together in the middle of the piece at the wedding.

The Ice Factory, as a studio theatre, is a terrific venue for such an intimate show, and the use of the floor to write narrative on as the show progressed was a clever touch which was much appreciated by the audience. This mellifluous act tied in the thoughts, feelings and actions of the characters in a way rarely seen. Set was minimal, as were props, and this placed additional demand on the actors to utilise physical acting to, again, portray action and emotion. Lighting and sound were balanced, never intruding but always highlighting the performances.

Finally, is it a musical and just that? For me, no, (and as overheard from other audience members last night) it is a true piece of art which encompasses many different forms.

Bravo, TP, for allowing this to be produced as it showcases incredible talent and skill that is within the vibrant amateur scene here in South Devon.
