Tatra 97, was designed by Hans Ledwinka and produced from 1936 to 1939. There is little doubt this car later inspired Ferdinand Porsche with the design of his Kdf Wagen, later the Beetle.

MORRIS MINOR TOPS THE LIST

Twelve years on, Practical Classics magazine asked readers to vote again for their favourite classic car and in this month's issue the results for the top 100 classics were published.

Space prevents listing the results in full, but there were many new entries while some old favourites slipped down the rankings.

Top, for the second time, was the Morris Minor, with the E Type Jag again holding its second place. The Austin Mini moved up to third position.

Poles apart in every way, but sharing new entry status, was the pre war Austin Seven (22) and the Rover 75 (24).

In all there were 32 new entries, including the above and, happily, the Jowett Javelin (56). The majority of new entries were cars of the 70s, 80s, and newer, for example MGF (23), NSU Ro80 (31) and Austin Allegro (88).

The trend of 'newer' classics appearing in the list is interesting and possibly reflects to demographic of the readers. It suggests that younger people are coming into the hobby and buying cars which were familiar to them in their youth and which they can afford now.

Whatever the reason, it's a good thing. Many of these cars are very rare and must be saved. Also, young buyers now, may move onto older vehicles later. Anyway, every classic was new once.

Oh, the Lada Niva is in at 99. Hurrah!

FUEL FOR THOUGHT

Whilst helping to tune an MG the other day and having already checked and balanced the twin SU carburettors, cleaned and checked all of the plugs, leads and distributor, we came to the point of setting the ignition advance timing.

The timing was set to the recommended 10 deg BTDC (Before Top Dead Centre) and the mechanical and vacuum advance on the distributor were checked and were working properly.

The engine at this point was ticking over nice and smoothly with no misfires and was very responsive to the throttle. However, when the car was taken for a road test it had very poor acceleration and was markedly unresponsive.

After several checks to make sure that none of the settings had altered and several minutes of head scratching, it was decided to try advancing the timing a little. This was done gradually and in all the timing was advanced to approximately 16 deg BTDC with the engine running at about 850 rpm and then road tested again.

Following a road test, the owner reported the difference in the performance of the car was noticeably different and was running like a 'dream'.

CONCLUSIONS

I have since been looking for an explanation for this and have found a web site which explains the difference between the old leaded fuels (which should be used in this type of car) and the modern fuels that we can get today. It all seems to boil down to the fact that the more modern fuels have a slower burning time meaning that to get the same amount of power out of the same measure of fuel you need to fire the ignition spark earlier.

The A to Z of classics.....with a difference

T is for Tatra T613

This was a big car. A big car by anyone's standards, at 16ft 6ins in length and nearly 6ft wide.

The body design was by Vignale and the attractive proportions disguised the rear end location of an air cooled V8 of 3.5 litres. This was powerful engine, with twin, double overhead, camshafts and two twin choke carbs., delivering 160bhp and 200bhp when fitted with fuel injection.

It could stop too, with huge ventilated servo disc brakes all round and independent suspension front and rear. Tyres were low profile radials.

Now, most people would expect the handling to be 'wayward', especially when pushing on through corners. In an *Autocar* road test of November '77, John Hartley observed "at quite respectable speeds, the Tatra went round [corners] smoothly, with neutral characteristics. With the big fat tyres there is a lot of cornering power, but once that back end goes, it would take some catching." He went on to enthuse about the top speed of 118mph and the quietness of the engine at this speed, with 5000 rpm showing on the rev counter.

The car, available with two or four doors, was not produced in huge numbers and rarely seen outside, what was then Czechoslovakia, being mainly for government officials.

Produced between 1973 and 1996, 11,000 cars were manufactured. The design, which may seem outdated now, followed the concept of earlier Tatras (rigid backbone type chassis with independent suspension all round and after 1934, always a rear engine), but without the central stabilising fin of earlier Tatras.

The T613 was mechanically similar to its predecessor the T603, but it wasn't the last big Tatra: the T613 morphed into the T700 in 1996, but few were produced and Tatra ceased manufacturing cars in 1999.





Tatra can trace its origins to 1850 and is the third oldest car manufacturer in the world, after Daimler and Peugeot. Located in Koprivnice, the company name is taken from the Tatra mountains on the Polish / Slovac border.

Tatra is associated with the production of technically advanced, luxury cars developed by its gifted designer Hans Ledwinka. These were also highly streamlined and many featured a 'dorsal' stabilising fin at the rear.

Hans Ledwinka was known socially to Ferdinand Porsche and Hitler. Many attribute the design of the VW Beetle to Ledwinka and his T87. The T87 (1936-'39) was streamlined and had an air cooled flat four engine.

Ferdinand Porsche admitted 'to have looked over Ledwinka's shoulders' while designing the Volkswagen. In 1965 VW paid Tatra 1 million DM in compensation.

Tatra remains a producer of advanced and specialist trucks.
