WHAT LIES BENEATH

Now I know like me you all like to keep your cars cleaned and polished to make us feel proud of whatever we drive, but how many of us think about the underbody apart from ITV time. Now we have owned the Hillman minx for 6 years and when we bought it and I checked underneath it was all nice and clean with a good solid coat of underseal, but unfortunately living in Spain our cars are exposed to greater differences in temperature throughout the year and also the roads here all have a lot of loose grit which in effect shotblasts the underside. I was dismayed that on inspection this year I found a a lot of loose underseal and surface rust starting to form.

TIME FOR ACTION

Not wanting this to deteriorate any further I decided some thing needed to be done so I purchased some Jelonite rust converter and inhibitor and some spray cans of underseal and set to with a wire brush and scraper preparing small sections of the body at a time and of course wearing eye protection a mask and gloves at all times as it gets pretty mucky under there.

Once prepared the exposed rusty metal is treated to a liberal coat of Jelonite with an old paint brush and the instructions say to leave for a couple of hours to dry as it not only cures the rust but is also a primer for the top coats, now I always like to leave it overnight just to be sure.

THE USE OF TRIANGLES MAY BE SCRAPPED.

THE DIRECTORATE GENERAL OF TRAFFIC (DGT) IS SAID TO BE CONTEMPLATING ELIMINATING THE OBLIGATION TO PLACE THE ORANGE EMERGENCY TRIANGLES

IN THE EVENT OF A VEHICLE BREAKING DOWN IN THE MIDDLE OF A MOTORWAY OR DUAL CARRIAGEWAY. THIS MOVE IS A RESULT OF A MARKED INCREASE IN THE NUMBER OF ROAD ACCIDENTS.

PERE NAVARRO, THE DIRECTOR OF THE DGT, STATED AS MUCH DURING A PRESS BRIEFING OF TUESDAY APRIL 4TH. HE EXPLAINED "LAST YEAR THERE WERE SIXTEEN DEATHS ON MOTORWAYS AND DUAL CARRIAGEWAYS OF PEOPLE WHO HAD GOT OUT OF THEIR VEHICLE" THE DGT DIRECTOR ADDED THAT ONE IN EVERY TEN ROAD DEATHS WAS CAUSED BY SOMEBODY BEING HIT BY A CAR.

CURRENTLY WHEN A VEHICLE SUFFERS A ROAD ACCIDENT, IT IS COMPULSORY FOR THE DRIVER TO SIGNAL IT TO OTHER ROAD USERS, EITHER WITH THE EMERGENCY TRIANGLES OR WITH THE V-16 EMERGENCY LIGHT, WHICH IS PLACED ON THE ROOF OF THE CAR AND WILL EVENTUALLY REPLACE THE TRIANGLES.

HOWEVER, THIS NEW REGULATION WILL NOT COMPULSORY UNTIL JANUARY 2026. SO IN THE MEANTIME, BOTH FORMS OF SIGNALLING WILL CO-EXIST. THERE WILL STILL BE DRIVERS WHO OPT FOR THE TRIANGLES AND HAVE TO GET OUT OF THEIR CAR TO PLACE IT, RUNNING THE RISK OF BEING KNOCKED DOWN.

THEREFORE, IN VIEW OF THE DANGER, THE DGT IS 'ASSESSING' HOW TO ELIMINATE THE OBLIGATION OF SIGNALLING ON MOTORWAYS AND DUAL CARRIAGEWAYS. THIS IS SOMETHING THAT OTHER COUNTRIES HAVE ALREADY PUT INTO PRACTICE THE DGT SOURCES CONFIRMED TO A NEWS SOURCE. PERRE NAVARRO IS STUDYING HOW TO DO IT AT A REGULATORY LEVEL.






