

29 Arrests Including One Woman in the First Week of July

The Bahrain Human Rights Society (BHRS) said in its weekly report for the first week of July that “29 arrest cases were documented, including one woman and three children. Several were later released. 26 house raids were also reported.”

BHRS also stated in its report that “45 peaceful protests were carried out. 11 different villages and towns were subjected to suppression with the use of tear gas and shotguns.”

The organization added that “several injuries and instances of suffocation among peaceful protestors due to tear gas were recorded in Sitra, Ma’ameer, Bilad al-Qadeem, Abu Saiba, and Shakhoora.”

Moreover, there were other violations including “the raid of the Imam al-Baqer mosque by security forces, the breaking of a mosque’s door in A’ali, and the vandalism of a citizen’s car in Duraz.”

As for judiciary sentences during the first week of July, courts handed down 38 years and six months of imprisonment sentences to 22 citizens.
