We are writing to raise our concerns over upcoming Formula 1 (F1) races in Gulf countries, with the season opening in Bahrain, followed by a race in Saudi Arabia. Both states, as well as the United Arab Emirates (UAE), are participants in the Saudi-led military coalition waging an ongoing war in Yemen.

The coalition has <u>committed</u> war crimes during their campaign in Yemen over the past seven years and contributed to what the United Nations has <u>termed</u> "the world's worst humanitarian crisis". This year alone, in a single airstrike the Saudi-led coalition <u>killed</u> at least 100 people. The three Gulf countries' participation in the catastrophic war has been met with silence on the part of the Fédération Internationale de l'Automobile (FIA) and F1, whilst Bahrain has been rewarded with both what is <u>believed</u> to be the "longest race contract deal ever signed" and Gulf Air Grand Prix opening race of the season, and Saudi Arabia benefitted from being added to the F1 calendar despite its appalling rights record.

We note that you met with Mohammed bin Zayed, the *de facto* leader of the UAE, where he <u>congratulated</u> you on your election as FIA President, wishing you "success in representing the UAE in the best possible manner, reflecting its bright image worldwide", whilst you also <u>received</u> a medal of honour from King Hamad bin Isa AlKhalifa of Bahrain in 2004. These affiliations should not prevent you from taking a public stance against the ongoing conflict in Yemen and we rather hope that your relationships with Gulf statesmen can help to influence positive change.

We applaud your position on Ukraine and we are encouraged by your explicit public <u>condemnation</u> of the Russian invasion and your expression of "sadness and shock" for victims in Ukraine. Whilst we fully support the proactive steps taken by the FIA on this front, we are concerned that you have yet to take similar measures when it comes to Gulf nations, and we ask that you apply the same moral standards in condemning violations and supporting victims in all countries where F1 races take place.

Victims include individuals such as Dr Abduljalil AlSingace, who has been unlawfully imprisoned for over a decade in Bahrain simply for calling for democracy, as have Hassan Mushaima and Sheikh Ali Salman. Naji Fateel, Ali AlHajee, Sayed Nizar Alwadaei and six children also remain <u>arbitrarily detained</u> in Bahrain, whilst torture victims Mohammed Ramadhan and Husain Moosa are at risk of imminent execution along with 24 others. In <u>Saudi Arabia</u>, 81 individuals were <u>executed</u> this weekend. People like Salma Al-Awda and Hassan Farhan Al-Maliki continue to face the death penalty, and earlier this month another child <u>defendant</u>, who was 14-years-old at the time of their alleged crime, was again sentenced to death by the regime. In the UAE, leading human rights activist <u>Ahmed Mansoor</u> remains wrongfully behind bars.

We are concerned that the FIA and F1 are actively facilitating sportswashing in Gulf countries and their continued failure to raise abuses committed by these regimes creates a stark double standard. We thus urge the FIA to apply the same standards of commitment to human rights across all countries and use your platform to publicly raise the aforementioned concerns and individual cases, publicly sympathise with these victims and establish a clear human rights policy.
