REFLECTIONS

"Prepare the way of the Lord, make his paths straight"

My late Father worked at the College of Arms so whenever I hear the term "Herald" I think of men dressed in richly embroidered tabards wearing black patent leather shoes with silver buckles. John the Baptist is often described as a herald but he dressed in camel's hair with a leather belt around his waist. He is not the kind of man most of us would like to meet. Apart from his wild appearance you get the impression that he would read your soul and that he might not hesitate to shout out your sins for all your friends to hear. His language is extreme and you can only excuse him because he was utterly committed to God and was transparently spiritual.

But John is a herald. He is preparing the way for Jesus and the kingdom. Preparing the people for the kingdom involved, first of all, the call to repentance. John, therefore, baptises with a baptism of repentance. He is fully in the tradition of the Old Testament prophets as he demands a change of heart and mind in all who would hope to be worthy of receiving the Lord's kingdom. John quotes Isaiah "Prepare the way of the Lord; make straight his path"

Let us allow these words challenge us. We are as Christians, at one and the same time, preparing for the coming of Jesus at Christmas and for the coming of Christ in glory at the end of time, Let us therefore, level the mountains and hills that are our sins. Let us fill in the valleys that are our failures and omissions. Let us smooth out the roughness of our incivility towards others. May we seek forgiveness for our false idols, our excessive consumerism, our hollow sophistication and our wrong priorities. In this way, we will "prepare the straight way of the Lord" in our hearts this Christmas and at life's end.

Welcome to our services today Second Sunday of Advent 6th December 2020

Collect

O Lord, raise up, we pray, your power and come among us, and with great might succour us; that whereas, through our sins and wickedness we are grievously hindered in running the race that is set before us, your bountiful grace and mercy may speedily help and deliver us; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, to whom with you and the Holy Spirit, be honour and glory, now and for ever.

First Reading: Isaiah 40.1-11

Comfort, O comfort my people, says your God. Speak tenderly to Jerusalem, and cry to her that she has served her term, that her penalty is paid, that she has received from the LORD's hand double for all her sins. A voice cries out: 'In the wilderness prepare the way of the LORD, make straight in the desert a highway for our God. Every valley shall be lifted up, and every mountain and hill be made low; the uneven ground shall become level, and the rough places a plain. Then the glory of the LORD shall be revealed, and all people shall see it together, for the mouth of the LORD has spoken.' A voice says, 'Cry out!' And I said, 'What shall I cry?' All people are grass, their constancy is like the flower of the field. The grass withers, the flower fades, when the breath of the LORD blows upon it; surely the people are grass. The grass withers, the flower fades; but the word of our God will stand for ever. Get you up to a high mountain, O Zion, herald of good tidings; lift up your voice with strength, O Jerusalem, herald of good tidings, lift it up, do not fear; say to the cities of Judah, 'Here is your God!' See, the Lord GOD comes with might, and his arm rules for him; his reward is with him, and his recompense before him. He will feed his flock like a shepherd; he will gather the lambs in his arms, and carry them in his bosom, and gently lead the mother sheep.

Gospel: Mark 1.1-8

The beginning of the good news of Jesus Christ, the Son of God. As it is written in the prophet Isaiah, 'See, I am sending my messenger ahead of you, who will prepare your way; the voice of one crying out in the wilderness: "Prepare the way of the Lord, make his paths straight", John the baptizer appeared in the wilderness, proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. And people from the whole Judean countryside and all the people of Jerusalem were going out to him, and were baptized by him in the river Jordan, confessing their sins. Now John was clothed with camel's hair, with a leather belt around his waist, and he ate locusts and wild honey. He proclaimed, 'The one who is more powerful than I is coming after me; I am not worthy to stoop down and untie the thong of his sandals. I have baptized you with water; but he will baptize you with the Holy Spirit.'

Post Communion

Father in heaven, who sent your Son to redeem the world and will send him again to be our judge: give us grace so to imitate him in the humility and purity of his first coming that, when he comes again, we may be ready to greet him with joyful love and firm faith; through Jesus Christ our Lord.

MINISTER'S LETTER

Dear Friends

A news item on BBC Look East on 23 November featured a couple who covered the front of their house and the whole of their front gardens with Christmas lights which were switched on with great ceremony. The next item of news showed desperate shop keepers preparing to make the most of the opportunity to sell as much as possible between the end of "lock down" and Christmas. "Whatever happened to Advent?" I thought that the season with its traditional themes for meditation on the Four Last Things- Death, Judgement, Heaven and Hell was a time for quiet reflection and prayer.

For Christians Advent is a season of preparation leading up to the glorious celebration of our Lord's coming into the world. In spite of the many restrictions placed upon us there is still around us a magic in the air which casts a supernatural spell which never seems to fail - even for the Scroogiest of Scrooges. For most it doesn't last much past Boxing Day.

But the Son of Man did not become man so that life could be transformed for one day out of 365. Jesus came so that all life, every day and in every way might be different. And it can be, for Jesus promised nothing less than the power of Almighty God to bring about change. The son of God visited and redeemed his people.

So alongside our material preparations let us make some spiritual preparations- perhaps putting aside some time each day for prayer, reflection, and meditation or reading the bible Mother Teresa wrote "The season of advent is like springtime in nature when everything is renewed and is fresh. Advent is also meant to do this to us, refresh us and make us spiritually healthy, so we can receive Christ in whatever form he may come to us personally".

May God bless you abundantly as you prepare to welcome Jesus.
