## Collect

Almighty and everlasting God, who in your tender love towards the human race sent your Son our Saviour Jesus Christ to take upon him our flesh and to suffer death upon the cross: grant that we may follow the example of his patience and humility, and also be made partakers of his resurrection; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever.

First Reading: Philippians 2.5-11
Let the same mind be in you that was in Christ Jesus, who, though he was in the form of God, did not regard equality with God as something to be exploited, but emptied himself, taking the form of a slave, being born in human likeness. And being found in human form, he humbled himself and became obedient to the point of death even death on a cross. Therefore God also highly exalted him and gave him the name that is above every name, so that at the name of Jesus every knee should bend, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue should confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

## REFLECTIONS

It happens. Two valued Christian workers disagree. The apostle Paul was concerned that these two of his fellow workers, Euodia and Syntyche, should be reconciled. (See Philippians 4.2-3). Perhaps with them in his mind he wrote that 'complete his joy by being of the same mind, having the same love, being in one accord and of one mind.' Verse 2. And to encourage them to re-think things he points them to the example of true humility as seen in Jesus. A humility that was grounded in the love that he shared with his Father, and rooted in a steely determination to obey his Father's will, sealed and delivered on the cross.

As we reflect on those moving events that we recall in Holy Week let us consider Jesus who truly humbled himself, epitomised with his washing of the tired and dirty feet of his chosen disciples. The Son of God, he submitted himself to the hands of wicked men who were determined to end his life, not realising that it was in his death that he would fulfil his purpose to achieve salvation for a lost mankind.

On this Palm Sunday we remember the hymn
Sometimes they strew his way, and his sweet praises sing; Resounding all the day, hosannas to their King...... Then.....

Here might I stay and sing: no story so divine;
Never was love, dear King, never was grief like thine!
This is my friend, in whose sweet praise,
I all my days could gladly spend.
I like to think that reading Paul's letter, Euodia and Syntyche prayed and patched things up and got on serving the Lord together again. May the Lord's example as we think of him especially this week, encourage us to be of the same mind.
