The Grapevine

COVERING THE PARISHES OF SAFFRON WALDEN, WIMBISH, DEBDEN, ASHDON AND HADSTOCK

Welcome to our services today Fifth Sunday of Easter 2nd May 2021

Collect

Almighty God, who through your only-begotten Son Jesus Christ have overcome death and opened to us the gate of everlasting life: grant that, as by your grace going before us you put into our minds good desires, so by your continual help we may bring them to good effect; through Jesus Christ our risen Lord.

First Reading: Acts 8.26-40

An angel of the Lord said to Philip, 'Get up and go towards the south to the road that goes down from Jerusalem to Gaza.' (This is a wilderness road.) So he got up and went. Now there was an Ethiopian eunuch, a court official of the Candace, queen of the Ethiopians, in charge of her entire treasury. He had come to Jerusalem to worship and was returning home; seated in his chariot, he was reading the prophet Isaiah. Then the Spirit said to Philip, 'Go over to this chariot and join it.' So Philip ran up to it and heard him reading the prophet Isaiah. He asked, 'Do you understand what you are reading?' He replied, 'How can I, unless someone guides me?' And he invited Philip to get in and sit beside him. Now the passage of the scripture that he was 'Like a sheep he was led to the reading was this: slaughter, and like a lamb silent before its shearer, so he does not open his mouth. In his humiliation justice was denied him. Who can describe his generation? For his life is taken away from the earth.' The eunuch asked Philip, 'About whom, may I ask you, does the prophet say this, about himself or about someone else?' Then Philip began to speak, and starting with this scripture, he proclaimed to him the good news about Jesus. As they were going along the road, they came to some water; and the eunuch said, 'Look, here is water! What is to prevent me from being baptized?' He commanded the chariot to stop, and both of them, Philip and the eunuch, went down into the water, and Philip baptized him. When they came up out of the water, the Spirit of the Lord snatched Philip away; the eunuch saw him no more, and went on his way rejoicing. But Philip found himself at Azotus, and as he was passing through the region, he proclaimed the good news to all the towns until he came to Caesarea.

Gospel: John 15.1-8

Jesus said to his disciples: 'I am the true vine, and my Father is the vine-grower. He removes every branch in me that bears no fruit. Every branch that bears fruit he prunes to make it bear more fruit. You have already been cleansed by the word that I have spoken to you. Abide in me as I abide in you. Just as the branch cannot bear fruit by itself unless it abides in the vine, neither can you unless you abide in me. I am the vine, you are the branches. Those who abide in me and I in them bear much fruit, because apart from me you can do nothing. Whoever does not abide in me is thrown away like a branch and withers; such branches are gathered, thrown into the fire, and burned. If you abide in me, and my words abide in you, ask for whatever you wish, and it will be done for you. My Father is glorified by this, that you bear much fruit and become my disciples.'

REFLECTIONS - ANDY COLEBROOKE

Fans of *Gardeners' World* will know that everyone's favourite gardener, Monty Don, has been encouraging us to go out with the secateurs to do some pruning. This is a necessary task that will ensure healthy growth, hopefully resulting in glorious blooms and tasty fruits. Jesus takes this well-known aspect of garden husbandry and applies it to our life with him: Jesus is the vine, and we are the branches. The vine provides lifegiving sap to course through its branches, enabling them to bear fruit. Branches can't bear fruit alone; they must remain connected to the vine. The point is well made: if we want lives that are fruitful for God, we must stay close to Jesus. Clearly, the apostle Philip did just that, for our reading from Acts records a most productive incident in his life: his close association with Jesus resulted in the gospel being taken to Ethiopia where it has remained firmly rooted ever since.

Going deeper...

In his book *Being Christian* Rowan Williams gives a simple meaning to sharing in the Eucharist: 'In Holy Communion, Jesus Christ tells us that he wants our company.' And at that service we sometimes ask the Lord 'that we may evermore dwell in him, and he in us'. This is vine and branches imagery. We are guests at the Lord's table, called to dwell, to make our home in Jesus, before being sent out in his name, to bear the fruit of that partnership.

I wonder...

Jesus says the vine-grower strips the vine of unproductive growth and trims the rest to encourage further fruiting. Can I think of times when God has 'pruned' me for greater fruitfulness?

Come! Spirit of Love! Penetrate and transform us by the action of your purifying life. May your constant, brooding love bring forth in us more love and all the graces and works of love. Give us grace to remain still under its action, and may that humble stillness be our prayer. Amen.
