Collect

Almighty and everlasting God, by whose Spirit the whole body of the Church is governed and sanctified: hear our prayer which we offer for all your faithful people, that in their vocation and ministry they may serve you in holiness and truth to the glory of your name; through our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever.

First Reading: 2 Corinthians 12.2-10

I know a person in Christ who fourteen years ago was caught up to the third heaven – whether in the body or out of the body I do not know; God knows. And I know that such a person – whether in the body or out of the body I do not know; God knows – was caught up into Paradise and heard things that are not to be told, that no mortal is permitted to repeat. On behalf of such a one I will boast, but on my own behalf I will not boast, except of my weaknesses. But if I wish to boast, I will not be a fool, for I will be speaking the truth. But I refrain from it, so that no one may think better of me than what is seen in me or heard from me, even considering the exceptional character of the revelations. Therefore, to keep me from being too elated, a thorn was given me in the flesh, a messenger of Satan to torment me, to keep me from being too elated. Three times I appealed to the Lord about this, that it would leave me, but he said to me, 'My grace is sufficient for you, for power is made perfect in weakness.' So, I will boast all the more gladly of my weaknesses, so that the power of Christ may dwell in me. Therefore I am content with weaknesses, insults, hardships, persecutions, and calamities for the sake of Christ; for whenever I am weak, then I am strong.

Gospel: Mark 6.1-13

Jesus came to his home town, and his disciples followed him. On the sabbath he began to teach in the synagogue, and many who heard him were astounded. They said, 'Where did this man get all this? What is this wisdom that has been given to him? What deeds of power are being done by his hands! Is not this the carpenter, the son of Mary and brother of James and Joses and Judas and Simon, and are not his sisters here with us?' And they took offence at him. Then Jesus said to them, 'Prophets are not without honour, except in their home town, and among their own kin, and in their own house.' And he could do no deed of power there, except that he laid his hands on a few sick people and cured them. And he was amazed at their unbelief. Then he went about among the villages teaching. He called the twelve and began to send them out two by two, and gave them authority over the unclean spirits. He ordered them to take nothing for their journey except a staff; no bread, no bag, no money in their belts; but to wear sandals and not to put on two tunics. He said to them, 'Wherever you enter a house, stay there until you leave the place. If any place will not welcome you and they refuse to hear you, as you leave, shake off the dust that is on your feet as a testimony against them.' So they went out and proclaimed that all should repent. They cast out many demons, and anointed with oil many who were sick and cured them.

REFLECTIONS - ANDY COLEBROOKE

In this week's epistle Paul speaks of a wonderful spiritual experience that he once had, describing it as being 'caught up to the third heaven'. He says that the things he heard are not to be reported, neither does he wish to boast about the experience, so he says no more. In which case we might wonder why he bothers to mention it! We know that the Corinthians prided themselves on exercising their spiritual gifts and thrilled about anything spectacular, so Paul's point seems to be to impress upon us that those spiritual highs, wonderful though they are, are not really what it is all about; they come and go, they never last forever. A mature Christian life is more often characterised by a steady evenness or is subject to frequent struggles, even suffering.

Going deeper

Paul's spiritual high was followed by a persistent difficulty, a 'thorn in the flesh'. This might have been a physical ailment or perhaps a reference to those who constantly opposed him, questioning his status as an apostle. Whatever it was, Paul saw it as an evil, coming directly from Satan. It clearly really troubled Paul, three times he asked the Lord to remove it, but without result. Instead, Paul learned that although he felt weak and powerless, God's grace was still at work within him. Indeed, his weakness had become a channel through which Christ's power could flow to others.

I wonder...

Do life's highs and lows blow me off course, distracting me from following Jesus or am I content to rest on God's grace?

Lord, when times get tough, may your promise to never leave us or forsake us, be an anchor for the soul, firm and secure against any storm. Amen.
