<u>Purpose</u>

To ensure participation on a national day of collective solidarity on 17th October, International Day for the Eradication of Poverty, amplifying the voice of people who live in poverty

Core objectives:

Full membership of APLE

The APLE Collective undertakes to support member groups and individuals by:

- Adhering to the values and principles listed above
- Committing to respect the independence of each member organisation /
- Amplifying the voice of member organisations through the APLE twitter account
- Providing support to carry out their responsibilities and ensuring opportunities are made available to share learning.
- Offering a 'buddying' support for individual members who request to develop individual skills and expertise in order to further the objects of APLE
- To give notice before each collective meeting and provide appropriate paperwork and information before each collective meeting
- To keep in touch with member organisations and provide time to reflect on involvement in APLE

As APLE members we ask members to:

- Confirm groups/individuals are led by lived experience of poverty and commit to the values of the APLE Collective
- Ensure groups understand and sign up to the principle that they are there to enable individuals within their organisations to take part
- Ensure their groups take responsibility to keep their members informed, feed in their views and work with them to remove barriers to their involvement
- Prepare for and participate in APLE main group meetings and mutually agreed working groups
- Whenever possible and depending on individual personal development, participate in learning and networking opportunities
- Whenever possible provide input, feedback and insights from their personal experience to inform the actions and decisions of the Collective.
- Encourage participation in APLE campaigns and initiatives either by running local events, facilitating activities, amplifying the APLE message through your social media platforms. APLE accepts that member groups will have varying levels of capacity and resources, so we ask that member groups agree to support in ways which they are able to
- Be representative and engage in a minimum of 4 APLE Collective planning and coordination meetings a year.
