

Guideline of the student body of the European University of Flensburg for exemption according to §74 paragraph 2 HSG

From 04.03.2020

On the basis of § 4 paragraph 5 sentence 2 of the contribution statutes of the student body of the European University of Flensburg, the following guideline will be issued after resolution of the student parliament on 04.03.2020.

§ 1 General

Students may be exempted on application, upon presentation of the appropriate documents. Applicants are obliged to declare their income and assets truthfully.

§ 2 Conditions for exemption

(1) The following persons may apply for an exemption for the semester ticket and the contribution to the student body:

1. students who have less than the requirement rate according to BAföG § 13 at their disposal and only have their own assets up to the amount of the assets allowance according to § 29 BAföG
2. single parent students who live with child(ren) in a household who are entitled to social benefits.
3. students who are entitled to housing benefit.
4. students who are entitled to integration assistance (SGB IX) due to a disability and can claim additional needs according to SGB II (or comparable).
5. if there is any other unreasonable burden resulting from the overall circumstances; economic reasons alone are not sufficient in this respect.

(2) The following persons may apply for an exemption for the contribution share to the student body:

1. students who are entitled to free public transport in accordance with the Severely Disabled Persons Act (SGB IX and Severely Disabled Persons Act § 59ff) with a severely disabled person's pass valid for the period of application and bearing the registration marks G, GI, aG, H, BI and the corresponding valid token. The above-mentioned documents must be presented in the original.
2. students who, due to a recognised severe disability, are demonstrably unable to use public transport. A valid severely handicapped person's identity card with suitable proofs in the original is to be presented.

§ 3 Procedure

(1) The application form for exemption can be obtained from the student advisory service BAföG & Soziales of the AStA. For the application for exemption, consultation with the AStA's social counselling service is mandatory.

(2) Applications for exemption from contributions must be submitted to the General Student Committee (AStA) within the following deadlines:

1. in the case of first-time enrollment, at the latest 4 weeks after the start of the lecture.
2. in the case of ongoing studies, at the latest one month before the beginning of the deadline for re-registration for the coming semester

(3) The application for exemption from contributions shall be submitted by the persons entitled to apply or by a person authorised to do so in writing, together with the original documents of the certificates and supporting documents required. The AStA may accept copies of these documents.

(4) An objection to the negative decision can be lodged in writing with the AStA Executive Board within one month of the decision being announced.

§ 4 Entry into force

This guideline comes into force on 04.03.2020. At the same time, the guideline of 27.06.2019 will expire.
