Søllested Landsbyordning, Denmark

Enter the world of co-creation of learning through re-wired space design as Lene Jensby Lange invites us all to have a look inside a recent Danish project. The project is at Sollested Landsbyordning, a small countryside K-9 school on the island of Falster. In August Lene and her team worked with the teachers to explore the role of learning space design in learning, well-being and classroom organisation. In September the headteacher Bitten Maria Bendtsen invited a team of pedagogue students to work hands on with the students to completely redesign every classroom, bringing in new elements and hacking old ones. We will take a look at what they came up with and their own approach as learners to transforming their learning spaces.

Agora School, Netherlands

Agora School in Roermond are taking things even further. Here students are lead designers of their own learning. Working in open hubs as well as outside the school, students explore passions and work on projects that open up various avenues of contextually relevant learning. The social kit is shaped by the daily tutoring group meeting and fellow students in your learning hub as well as your key team of coaches. Needless to say that you don't find any traditional classrooms in this school that has attracted a good amount of global attention for its dedication to shaping education around students' motivation.

We recognise learning is changing - propelled by some extraordinarily powerful new ubiquitous technologies and also by our rapidly changing world. We will explore some key questions and share approaches, already in existence, which have led to improved outcomes.

We may focus on:

How does the craft and practice of teaching keep up with these changes?

How do we engage young people and all those who work with them in becoming the creators not the consumers of a system of education?

How do we design future learning environments that recognise the importance of social and emotional well-being for all those who learn, live and work in them?
