SHOW ARRANGEMENTS & REGULATIONS

Prize Money 1st - £4.00, 2nd - £2.00, 3rd - £1.00 Sponsored Classes 1st - £5.00, 2nd - £3.00, 3rd - £2.00

Entry Fees. All classes 30p per entry Children 10p Show Arrangements:

Entries and Staging: Saturday 3rd September - 7.00pm - 9.00pm.

Sunday 4th September - 8.00am to 10.45am.

Judging to commence at 11.00am. Exhibit hall open to the public from 2.00pm to 3.30pm.

Presentation of trophies at 3.30pm.

Any produce not collected will be sold after the presentations, the proceeds going towards the cost of staging the Show.

- **1**. The members' classes in each section are confined to members and their families of Baildon Horticultural Society. Must be members for at least one month before the show. Open classes are open to all.
- **2**. All exhibits are to be grown or made by the exhibitor. In classes 41, 42, the plant must have been in the owner's possession for not less than 3 months.
- 3. Exhibitors in all classes must be amateur.
- Amateur A person who, not being a professional either with or without paid or unpaid assistance but not employing a full-time gardener, maintains a garden or grows plants, flowers, fruit or vegetables for pleasure and enjoyment and not for his/her livelihood.
- 4. The committee reserves the right to inspect exhibitor's gardens or allotments.
- **5.** The Society undertakes to give reasonable protection to exhibits but will not be responsible for loss or damage exhibits may sustain during the show and their removal.
- **6.** The judge's decision will in all cases be final, unless a protest is made before 3.00pm on the day of the show, to the secretary in writing, with a deposit of $\mathfrak{L}1$.
- 7. The committee have power to deal with any matter that may arise and their decision is final.
- 8. All exhibits to be staged in Society vases except where otherwise stated.
- **9**. No exhibits to be interfered with after being staged. Any alteration of staging to be done by stewards only.
- 10. All persons, except officials, to vacate the room before judging commences.
- 11. Due to unforeseen circumstances we will not be awarding points this year.
- **12.** Any prize may be withheld or modified if the exhibits are considered unworthy of the prize offered.
- **13.** Exhibits should not be removed until after prize giving. Prize money will be paid after the presentation ceremony.
- 14. You may enter as many entries in any class.
- **15.** All prize money must be collected from the office on the day of the show, any monies not collected will be regarded as a donation to the society.
