When Jesus first started to gather his disciples around him, they would tell their friends about him. This sometimes got a cynical response. "Come and see," they'd reply – and the doubter, having seen with his own eyes, believed and followed.

This month the Church of England churches in the area are running a number of events over the same long weekend, from Thurs 12<sup>th</sup> to Sun 15<sup>th</sup> March. We've got comedian Jimmy Cricket coming to the Priory, a Grand Gala Dinner for the RNLI at Emmanuel, a family film at Christ Church, a Quiz night in Reighton, a clock-blessing in Ulrome, an Environment Question Time at the Living Seas Centre at South Landing, and a pop-up craft afternoon in the upstairs café in Boyes. In addition Bishop Graham will be blessing the fishing boats in the harbour and attending a match at the rugby club.

We'll eat first, then have an opportunity to quiz the Bishop – no question is off-limits! Bishop Graham came to prominence in his part of Yorkshire for campaigning against fracking, and he is a very lively and engaging speaker.

We're trying to encourage all our church people in the intervening couple of weeks to say, "I'm going to... It'll be great: would you like to come with me?" In other words, don't take our word for it, come and see for yourself. ### **Parish Council Meeting**

**Wednesday 12<sup>th</sup> February**

The Parish Council would again like to thank all 14 residents who came along to the meeting to meet Mr Paul Bellotti- Director of Communities and Environment at ERYC, Jane Evison, Jonathan Owen- Ward Councillors and our Local Police representative.

Mr Bellotti gave the good news to all the residents present that ERYC are quite happy for all the street furniture in Barmston, which included the planters, were to stay and informed them that should anyone have any further issues regarding this problem, they can contact ERYC direct. He is also looking into the possibility of erecting duck warning signs near the pond.

There will be a new modern Parish Council noticeboard being erected by the village pond. Mr Bellotti kindly offered the village the use of ERYC contractors to do the work to save any further problems.

Regards to the flooding at the pond, it is now in its final stages of administration and hopefully will be resolved very shortly.

We have now found a qualified contractor so, by the time the Village Voice is circulated, the new defibrillator should be up and running within the telephone box. A new defibrillator has had to be purchased and should be fully functional in days. The council has investigated training for the defibrillator which is now booked for 19<sup>th</sup> May at 7pm. Details to follow.
