Christmas Lights

Due to Covid 19 restrictions, unfortunately we can not do the normal light turn on this year. There is a rumour in the village that, in light of this, the council have arranged for Father Christmas to visit and turn the lights on for us on Monday 7th December at 6pm. Anybody who is out having their socially distanced walk at this time, you might happen to see him in the area around the pond. Just remember though, we are trying to keep this a secret!!

Firework Display

The council have been in receipt of various complaints following a firework display held on the Green/ Roundabout on Hollycroft held on Saturday 7th November.

The council did not know of or give any permission for this event. Any fireworks sent off from a public space comes under numerous laws and restrictions. For the people who have complained to the council and on Facebook about the fireworks falling on their property they should contact the organiser of the event. It is one of the legal requirements that they organise the removal of all projectiles. Any damage caused to your property can be claimed against their public liability. We hope this clarifies any misconceptions regarding the event.

If anybody wants to run an event in future on any public space, they must notify the appropriate authority in advance. There must be a detailed plan accompanied by a full risk assessment covering the event and must be covered by an insurance policy.

As regards to the Green/ Roundabout on Hollycroft, any event on it will also have to comply with the rules and regulations laid out by Public Highways as Hollycroft is not a private road.

Hare Coursing

We have had a hare coursing incident which was reported to the police in the fields between Hollycroft and Ulrome. We believe it to be the same group that were picked up at Gransmoor and had a long walk home as their car was impounded. If anyone sees any incidents that look suspicious in the area, feel free to report it as this often helps to build a picture of what is happening generally in our area.
