Fresh from his previous week's victory in the Yorkshire Marathon Championships, Barnsley Road Runners' Club star George Kay ran a superb race in Sunday's London to Brighton event over 53 miles to finish sixth overall in a splendid time of five hours, 49 minutes, 38 seconds. It was a run which earned him the Wilf Richards Cup for the first veteran over 40, and he led the Barnsley contingent to sixth place in the team event, with 150 points.

Other Road Runners' Club finishers were Paul Midwood (27<sup>th</sup> in 6-47-45), Barry Bedford (45<sup>th</sup> in 7-44-31), Gordon Standish (52<sup>nd</sup> in 8-06-40) and Ken Jordan (53<sup>rd</sup> in 8-07-22).

The local runners received admirable support from their seconds, who were wives of the competitors and members. Their help and encouragement along the route was invaluable.
