PARENT REFERENCE GUIDE

Please take the time to read the Parent Reference Guide for the Baseball Saskatoon 2020 season :

Before leaving for the Ballpark

- **Please Self Monitor:** First points in each checklist (Parent/Player). *Do not attend if any symptoms or situations excluding you from participating are present.*
- Prepare yourself and your player to contribute to a safe environment that everyone will enjoy during their experience at the ballpark. Everyone needs to take an active role.
- Be prepared that the ballpark will have new routines that are in place for everyone's safety and so we are able to participate under the current guidelines. ***Your cooperation is essential to keep our kids on the field.***

- Please realize this plan is subject to change
- **Please consider taking on the role of Health and Safety Coordinator for your team. We absolutely need one per team to help monitor social distancing and assist in establishing practices that follow the guidelines set out by Baseball Sask.**

General Ballpark Guidelines/Information

1. Do not arrive until 15 minutes prior to your session and do not linger upon completion of your event
2. Canteens are currently unavailable so prepare your athlete accordingly

4. Social Distancing / Health & Safety Measures

- Hand sanitizing
 - Teams and players need to have hand sanitizer available at team events. Teams will be given an initial supply of hand sanitizer, but supplies beyond this amount will become the responsibility of individual teams.
- Dugouts
 - Dugouts and high traffic areas will be disinfected by Baseball Saskatoon maintenance staff prior to scheduled league games. Teams will be responsible for disinfecting areas before and after practice sessions.
 - Dugout space needs to be expanded to allow for social distancing. Extended dugout space will be indicated with line paint and is not to be used by spectators.
 - Players are encouraged to bring their own seating for this area and keep their equipment in a personal area within the extended dugout.
- Spectators
 - Spectators are expected to maintain social distancing at all times and the number of spectators must remain under current guidelines.
 - Spectators are encouraged to view from a distance to allow social distancing to take place. At some ballparks, outfield viewing provides larger areas.
 - Spectators are encouraged to bring their own seating (lawn chair, blanket) and respect where that seating is placed to allow for social distancing of the group. Avoid contact with park seating.
 - At venues with more than one diamond, spectators are asked to stay at their diamond.
 - Respect extended dugout areas for teams
 - Please realize that you may be asked to move to respect social distancing or even leave the ball park so participants are able to continue to play if numbers are too large.

Thanks to everyone for their cooperation as we adapt to a new routine at the ballpark and get back to the game we all love.
