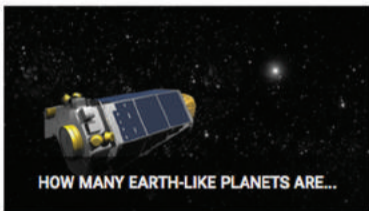

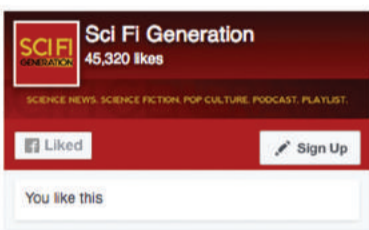
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## BERLIN SCI-FI FILM FESTIVAL RETURNS TO THE BABYLON IN NOVEMBER

Last year's Berlin Sci-Fi Film Festival showed 138 films from 38 countries and welcomed guests from all over the world. How do you follow something like that up? Simple. You do it again. Same place. And you add a few new things!

This year marks the third year for the festival, and this year's selection of independent science-fiction films from around the world will be unveiled at the **Babylon Cinema in Berlin, Germany on November 29 and 30, 2019**. This new date is two weeks later than usual, but the festival director, Alexander Pfander, believes that moving to two weeks later it allows for a better time to accommodate the festival, as the first couple of weeks in November is a busy time in Berlin.

The festival team has been working for months to expand and add new films as well as features. They will feature the European Premiere of the documentary film 'Artist Depiction' by produced and directed by **Brett Ryan Bonowicz**, who created 'Closer Than We Think', a documentary that was featured in last years festival.



Overview of the film:

*Conceptual artists Don Davis, Charles Lindsay, and Rick Guidice have helped bring NASA projects to life. Their incredible pioneering artwork, which helped define the aesthetics of futurism and space travel, is ubiquitous; and yet these artists have always been hidden behind the scenes. Until now.*



Alexander also shares that they have been invited to screen a re-run of the 2018 program at Il Kino theater/cafe in Berlin this year.

On November 30, they've also got an interesting workshop planned in collaboration with the director of Dublin Smartphone Film Festival. This one is going to focus on indie sci-fi films made on mobile phones.



And that's all they're sharing for NOW.

The final program will not be decided until September, and in the meantime, their judges are working their way through the festival's submissions.

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
