50 years have passed since the Queen was crowned, in 1952. Her father king George 6th died on the February the 6th 1952, but the queen didn't become crowned till June the 2nd 1952. The queen has travelled far and wide over and throughout different places of the world. She has even visited the Great Wall of China, on the third day of her state visit to the country. She has also visited many soap sets including the famous pub Queen Vic in East Enders.

She is married to Prince Phillip, who enjoyed the navy when he was younger. They have four children, these are Prince Charles, the Prince of Wales, and he married Lady Diana Spencer who died in 1997. Charles has two sons, Prince William of Wales (1982), and Prince Henry of Wales (1984). The queen's daughter Princess Royal otherwise known as Princess Anne is divorced to Captain Mark Phillips and has two children Peter and Sara. Her other two sons are, the Duke of York with two daughters, Princess Beatrice of York and Princess Eugenie of York, and Edward the Earl of Wessex, who his married to Sophie Rhys-Jones. The queen also had a sister, Princess Margaret who died earlier this year.

Smallpox Eradicated.

In 1952 a doctor called Edward Jenner found a cure for a disease named Smallpox, which was fatal to your health. Milkmaids (Cow milkers) would get cowpox - small blisters on the hands, which was not fatal. Edward found that all cowpox sufferers did not get smallpox. So by collecting the pus from the blisters of the women with cowpox and injecting this pus into smallpox sufferers, by 1980, smallpox was eradicated.

which was 2949 meters tall.

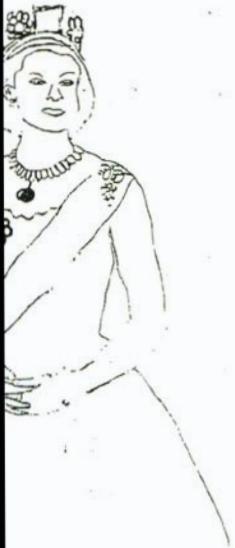


Did you know?

- You can see the golden slate coach today in the museum of London and the crowns jewels at the tower of London.
- The queen has made 251 official visits to 128 different countries in the last 50 years.
- The Queen has attended 31 royal variety shows. Today they are usually shown on television as well.
- The queen's real birthday is 21 April, but she has an official birthday in June. Usually there is ceremony called Trooping the Colour, which attracts many tourists to London.
- In 1977 to mark her silver jubilee the queen was given two tortoises in the Seychelles and a 7-year-old bull elephant called jumbo by the president of Cameroon.

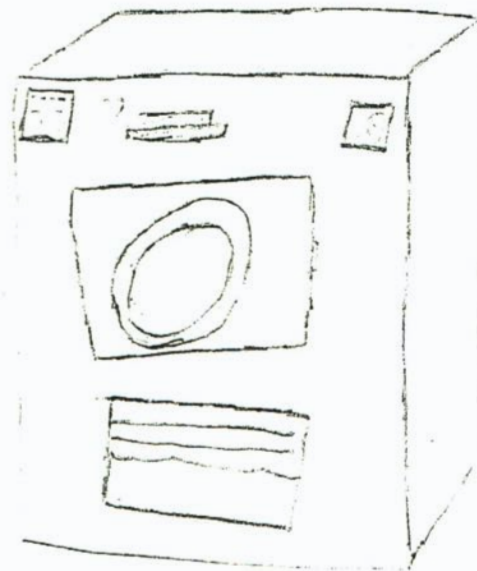
Those teenagers who were in fashion were 'w' or 'cool', but if you didn't fit in you were called 'square.' Fashions were always changing.

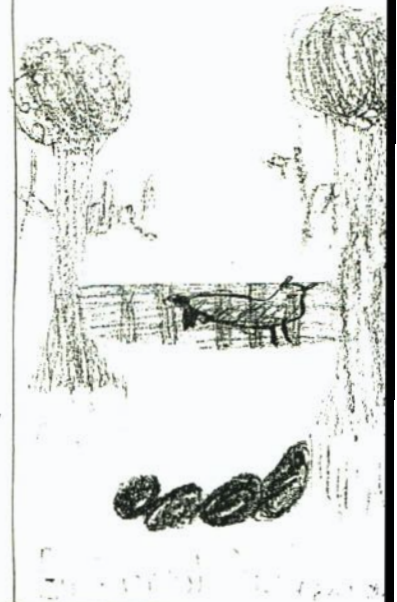
Miss Meehan a teacher from St Helens school who saw the events said "The corgi was so funny I couldn't stop laughing, he should have entered Crufts dog show!"

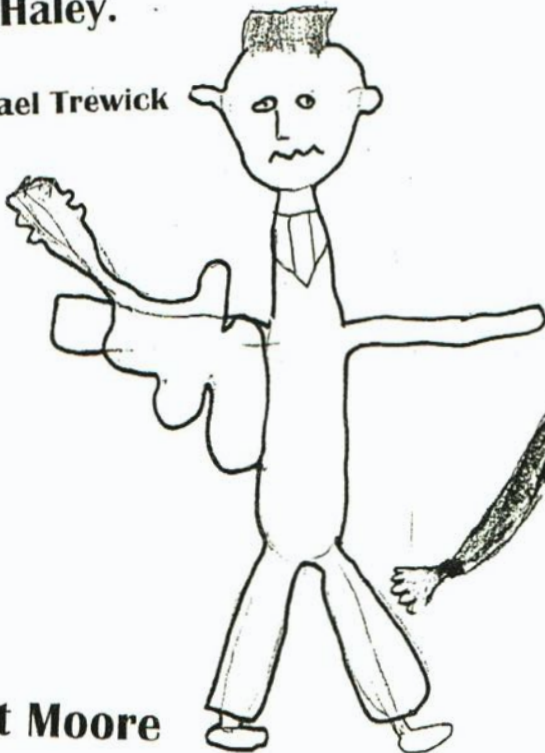

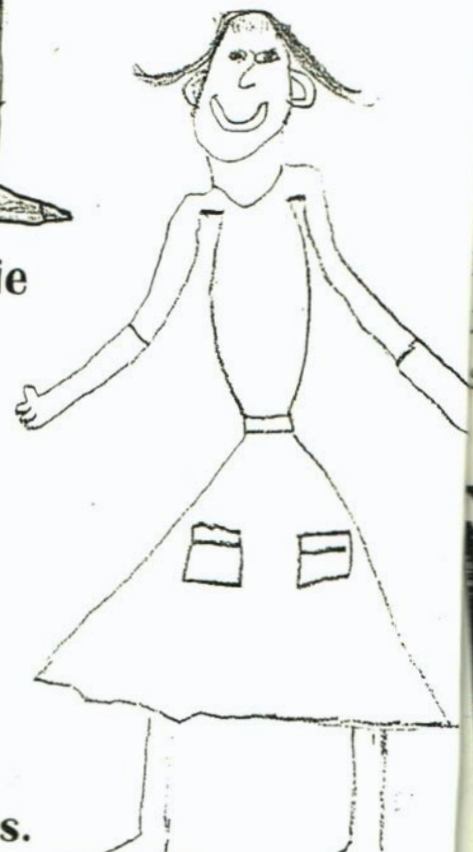

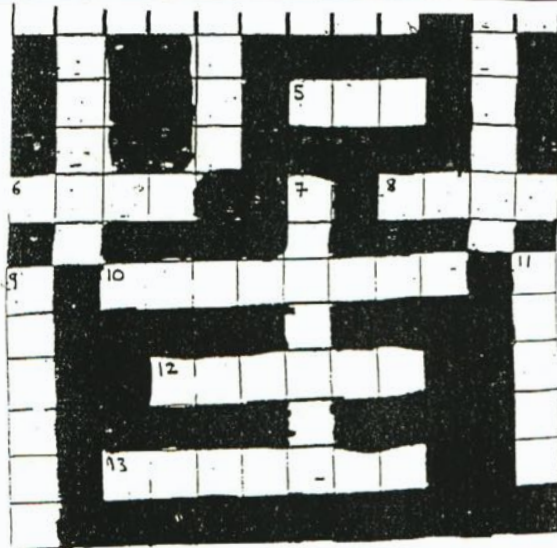
