
Those teenagers who were in fashion were 'w t' or 'cool', but if you didn't fit in you were called 'square.' Fashions were always changing.






In the early 1950s radios were the main form of home entertainment. After the coronation of Elizabeth II more people bought televisions but they were only black and white.

In 1956 ITV began broadcasting and it was much more popular than the BBC channel.





Children were often put into different classes. Those who were thought to be clever went to the 'A' class. The others went into either the 'B' or 'C' classes.




